SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS

SEOW Meeting Approval of Agenda/Minutes - J. Hoepfner

- Agenda for today’s meeting was reviewed and approved by consensus. The minutes of February 17, 2016 were reviewed and approved by consensus.

Emerging Issues and Trends

Opioids, Prescription Drugs, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - Su Min Oh

- **Prescription Drugs – FBI Video** - Shared information via e-mails with everyone by the FBI called *Chasing the Dragon, the Life of an Opiate Addict*. This video was released to educate young adults and all interested parties. Joel says he shared the video with tri county prescription task force and Ingham County Task Force. Looking for funding to be able to purchase spots for TV. Suggestion to send to the Michigan Association of Broadcasters. The over-prescriber list is not available yet due to cost issues, but MAPS are working on it and as soon as these issues resolve, they will contact Su Min, and Su Min will inform everyone. *Centers for Disease Control (CDC) Prevention Status Report*: Sent everyone a two (2) page summary to review. There are 10 public health issues and the CDC reviewed each state and ranked by color; Green = High (best), Yellow = Medium (better), Red = low (poor). The questions is what can we do to improve Michigan’s rating. Joel suggests that we make sure document is shared widely with coalitions and provider networks. It has already been shared with the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Directors.

Heroin – Reminder about HIV and Hepatitis (Hep) C vulnerability from Katie Macomber which will be presented at the next meeting. We have 11 counties that identified as at risk of rapid transmission of HIV or Hep C using the CDC indicators. One confirmed case of Acetyl Fentanyl overdose death in Michigan. This drug is illegal and the potency is five times more than heroin.

- **Legalizing Marijuana** – Rachel reports that a bill was introduced at the end of February; Senate Bill 813, non-medical marijuana code whose purpose is to legalize, regulate and tax recreational marijuana. It mentions marijuana lounges defined as an “entity registered to sell marijuana or marijuana products for onsite consumption by means other than smoking.” This bill is being watched.
- **E-cigarettes** – No new information nor movement.
- **Alcohol** – Sarah reports that the CDC has a competitive RFA grant for five states funded for a period of five (5) years, are applying for it and it is due in mid-April. Still in the process of hiring alcohol epidemiologist. On the behavioral respecter survey, the data for 2015 is from an initial quality check and looking to work with in June. Data Updates: Drug Overdose Deaths, PFS2015 Health Disparities – Su Min Oh

Su Min sent a link to everyone and talked about this one page draft document showing the number of drug poisoning deaths by type of drug from opioids to heroin and the trend between 1999 and 2014. Once the document is final everyone will be notified. A press release has already been completed. If you want to see the data by county, let Su Min know at ohs@michigan.gov. Data will eventually be placed on the Central Data Repository (CDR). Su Min explained and there was much discussion about how data is obtained based on opioids, heroin, and all variations of those drugs. The document ***Excerpt Health Disparities Impact Statement*** that was sent to SAMHSA and was reviewed by everyone. This document will be updated as more data and information becomes available. Liz comments that there is no way to address all everything across the board with all populations, but will be asking all the grantees to begin to develop their own impact statements and showing evidence what they are doing to work within these populations and will be worked into the Impact Statement.

Central Data Repository (CDR) Updates – Liz Agius

➤ Liz reports that Nick is in the process of working with new legends and color coding on CDR. The maps now show three color coding and will reflect differences across populations. Opioid hospitalizations and prescription data has been added and is new. Brooke will be adding new data soon. Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS) data will be added in a few weeks as a comparison. You will also be seeing a new layout with search visualizations and links to outside data, such as the county health ratings for University of Wisconsin. A new tab called “Resources” is in draft mode and will be added soon that will include a link to all the OROSC fact sheets, as well as other documents. Uploaded Joel’s EPI document showing 11 of the 46 page samples. Uploaded the PowerPoint used at the SUD Conference, the start of the “User Guide.” More information dissemination will be available. Brooke has been working with MPHI to learn the Prevention Data System (PDS) system and everyone who provides data to the PDS system will be seeing that we are summarizing the data by PIHP and will be providing data by tables on a quarterly basis. This should increase utilization and tracking in the PDS by ensuring that the data is being monitored and utilized. Keep checking your data repository. Liz went on to explain what everyone using the CDR will be able to do. If anyone has any comments, ideas, or suggestions, and how you are using data, please let Liz know at ad2634@wayne.edu. Su Min and Joel went on to explain what PDS is and how it works. Data on Opioids and prescription drugs have also been added to the CDR. Kudos from SEOW members on how helpful the CDR is. Joel asks Liz to conduct a walk-through on the CDR on updates at the next meeting, April 20.

Information/Updates Request for Partners – Su Min

➤ Su Min sent form requesting quarterly updates from partners and stakeholders; Education, Michigan State Police, and Poison Control. Concern that form will not be sent on a quarterly basis. Joel went on to explain the quarterly updates and its purpose. Will be addressed at the next meeting. MSP is still conducting data diving through University of Michigan. Sent Legislative analysis to everyone on the *Roadside Drug Testing Pilot Project*, which is the most updated information.
