SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS

SEOW Meeting Approval of Agenda/Minutes - J. Hoepfner

- Agenda for today’s meeting was reviewed and approved by consensus. The minutes of February 17, 2016 (corrected to read March 16, 2016) were reviewed and approved by consensus.

Update on Next Steps/Action Items from Previous Meeting – J. Hoepfner

- **HEP C/HIV Presentation** – *Joe Coyle*
- **Central Data Repository Walkthrough** – *Liz Agius and Brooke Dudek*
- **Poison Control Piece** – *Su Min Oh* – Contacted the Poison Control Center and they were happy to provide raw data to us on a quarterly basis. They need to know exactly what we need. A manual on toxicology exposure surveillance system text was sent, which will assist in making a determination on our needs. Sent the quarterly update to the Michigan State Police (MSP), Education, Michigan Primary Care Association (MPCA) and Mary Ludtke in Mental Health. To date one (1) “yes” response from Kim Kovalchick in Education. She will send the form to us in two weeks.

OROSC Updates – Larry Scott

- **Substance Abuse Mental Health and Substance Administration (SAMHSA) - Prescription Drug and Overdose Prevention Grant** – Intend to apply for the SAMHSA Prescription Drug and Overdose Prevention Grant. This would include educating prescribers, first responders, and purchasing and distributing NARCAN. Su Min will be working on the problem statement to determine the greatest need, which will inform our planning process. The Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) directors will also receive the same report on Friday. We do know that there are a number of successful and effective naloxone distribution and education projects throughout the state that we plan to learn from. Also conducting some outreach with Population Health and other state level agencies, departments, and partners. Application is due May 31, 2016.
- **SYNAR Meeting – 4/19/16** – At this meeting was a discussion on U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) inspection data and the number of retailers who have been non-compliant with the tobacco act of the FDA, which is parallel to the Youth Access to Tobacco that we have with Synar tobacco act; as this information will inform the PIHPs about those retailers that were found to be non-compliant with both the FDA and Synar and will help the Prepaid Inpatient Health Plans (PIHP) planning process. A coverage study is coming up this summer and SAMHSA would like to see an 80% or higher accuracy rate. Checking ID and asking clerks asking for age will help. The Synar violation rate was given of 15.5%. Su Min explains further details about the data results and Larry lets everyone know about more details of how inspections are conducted.

Emerging Issues and Trends

Opioids, Prescription Drugs, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - Su Min Oh

- **Prescription Drugs – FBI Video** - The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) called *Chasing the Dragon, the Life of an Opiate Addict* is now posted on the MDHHS Facebook and Twitter. Joel is still waiting on the TV station to let him know when airtime will be available and will let everyone know.
- **Heroin** – HIV and Hepatitis (Hep) C Presentation today.
- **Legalizing Marijuana** – Senate Bill 813 - No new information nor movement. Macomb County hosting a meeting on May 6, 2016 of which an attorney will be there who will analyze the proposals on the ballot. Thirty-seven (37) people have signed-up and they are from Genesee, Oakland, Wayne, Lakeshore, and Macomb. Also in attendance will be a Sheriff, PIHP Directors. Will arrange a community strategic plan.
- **E-cigarettes** – No new information nor movement. Larry says the FDA is looking to include these as a cigarette product and if this does happen we will have to redesign our youth tobacco inspections. Joel says we will revisit next month.
- **Alcohol** – Sara is now the Acting Director of the Bureau of Epidemiology. Corinne Miller is retired. Applied for the expansion of alcohol epidemiology program through the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) for five years.

HIV/HEP-C Vulnerability in Michigan – Joe Coyle

Joe presented to the group a PowerPoint presentation on HEP C/HIV and distributed the PowerPoint handout (attached). Of note, HEP C cases has shown an increase and because HEP C is more infectious than HIV, HEP C can be seen as marker for a risk for future HIV infection, whereby the CDC released a marker study. He went on to explain the marker study's purpose, indicators, etc. Michigan was in the top five percent (5%) and he went on to name the counties. This has not been made public. Recommendations are for states to look at HEP C and HIV surveillance data, Naloxone use, drug arrests, overdose deaths, enhance testing for HEP C and HIV, and to catch it early and prepare an action plan. He also went on to explain what is being done to date. A rapid response plan has been created if an outbreak is identified. May is Hepatitis Awareness Month. Partnerships are being created through counties and other groups have reached out to us. A fact sheet has been created and is published.

Central Data Repository (CDR) Walkthrough Updates – Liz Agius and Brooke Dudek

Brooke projected the CDR website on the screen and explained to everyone recent changes. Some of those changes included new dropdown tabs, corrections, Treatment Episode Data Set (TEDS), links to SUD conference, and sample documents, among others. Liz explained the data in YRBS. Su Min provided county level data, received BRFSS data, current smoking, etc. Data is 2010 by PIHP (formerly coordinating agencies).
