








What is MI Transportation Plan (MITP)?

- Michigan's State Long-Range Transportation Plan
- Federally required
- Establishes vision, goals, and objectives for Michigan's transportation system
- Sets policy framework for transportation investment decisions
- Policy-based plan adopted by State Transportation Commission



MDOT Jurisdiction



Why a revision?

- Extension of current plan
- New plan reaffirms:
 - Policy and framework of 2030 MITP and 2035 MITP
 - MDOT's vision
 - Goals, objectives, strategies and decision principles
- Updated with most recent data
- Interim step to keep plan current
- Extends horizon year to 2040
 - Establishes consistency with local partners
 - Maintains federally required 20-year horizon



Transportation Funding

State Transportation Funding Package:

- \$1.2 B in road and transit funding phased in overall several years
- Distributed amongst MDOT, county road commissions, cities and villages, and Comprehensive Transportation Fund

New Federal Legislation

- Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act
- Stable funding for next five years
- 5 percent increase in funding for 2016
- 2 percent increase per year from 2017-2020



Key Trends

- Moderate population and employment growth
- Increased congestion on transportation system
- Maintaining bridge and non-freeway pavement goals
- Connected and automated vehicle technology
- Decreased number of serious injuries on MDOT roads
