Destination Maps

During 2009, construction extends 8 miles on southbound I-675 in Saginaw County.

What To Do

Plan an alternative route, plan a backup alternate route in case of an incident on primary alternate, consider an alternate means of commuting (bus, carpool, or vanpool).

Motorist Information

During construction, signs will alert motorists to detours and lane closures on local roads above and below I-675.

MDOT has created an I-675 Improvements electronic mailing list, known as a "Listserv." This list will serve the motoring public and the media by providing regular updates regarding the progress of work on I-675.

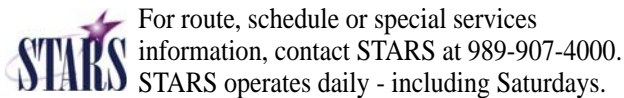

Area Transit Info

Saginaw Transit Authority Regional Services (STARS) is a public transportation agency serving Saginaw and the Metropolitan Region with over 2,700 riders daily. The STARS LIFT curb-to-curb service is an effective solution to mobility challenged citizens, annually serving over 48,000 senior citizens and persons with disabilities.



What

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is investing \$55 million during 2009 and 2010 for road and bridge construction work on 8 miles on I-675 in Saginaw County. The project includes concrete pavement repairs on I-675 and the interchange ramps. Bridge overlay and rehabilitation work on multiple bridges is scheduled, along with deck replacement on the Henry Marsh Bridge. Sidewalk improvements along Wadsworth, 5th, 6th and Fitzhugh streets in downtown Saginaw are also planned.

Where

Work begins in Buena Vista Township at the I-675/I-75 southern junction and extends north through the city of Saginaw and Zilwaukee, Saginaw, and Kochville townships to the I-675/I-75 northern junction.

When

I-675 southbound construction begins in May 2009. Southbound lanes will be closed, with traffic detoured to I-75. This work is expected to be completed by December 2009. I-675 northbound traffic will remain on I-675 northbound lanes.

MDOT will provide an updated destinations guide with specific directions to area destinations before the 2010 construction season begins.

Why

The purpose of these improvements is to increase traffic safety and improve the overall condition of this highway.

MDOT's 2009 reduced highway program strategy focuses on preservation and keeping motorists mobile, informed and safe.

Traffic Restrictions

Lane closures and detours will be in effect while construction work is under way. Local road closures and ramp closures also will be required. Northbound and southbound highway closures will alternate during the consecutive construction seasons, with I-675 traffic detoured to I-75.

From the north (May, July thru December):

- I-75 south to I-675 south (Exit 155). Take I-675 south to Tittabawassee Road (Exit 6). Turn left or right onto Tittabawassee Road to local destination.

From the north (June to July):

- I-75 south to M-84 south (Exit 160). Turn right on M-84 and go south to local destination.

From the south:

- I-75 north to I-675 north (Exit 150). Take I-675 north to Tittabawassee Road (Exit 6). Turn left or right onto Tittabawassee Road to local destination.

To Old Town Saginaw

DIRECTIONS:

From the north:

- I-75 south to I-675 north (Exit 150). Take I-675 north to M-58 (Davenport Road) (Exit 3) to local destination.

From the south:

- I-75 north to I-675 north (Exit 150). Take I-675 north to M-58 (Davenport Road) (Exit 3) to local destination.

To Downtown Saginaw

DIRECTIONS:

From the north:

- I-75 south to I-675 north (Exit 150). Take I-675 north to M-13/5th and 6th streets (Exit 2). Merge onto Wadsworth. Follow Wadsworth to M-13. Turn left or right on M-13 to local destination.

From the south:

- I-75 north to I-675 north (Exit 150). Take I-675 north to M-13/5th and 6th streets (Exit 2). Merge onto Wadsworth. Follow Wadsworth to M-13. Turn left or right on M-13 to local destination.

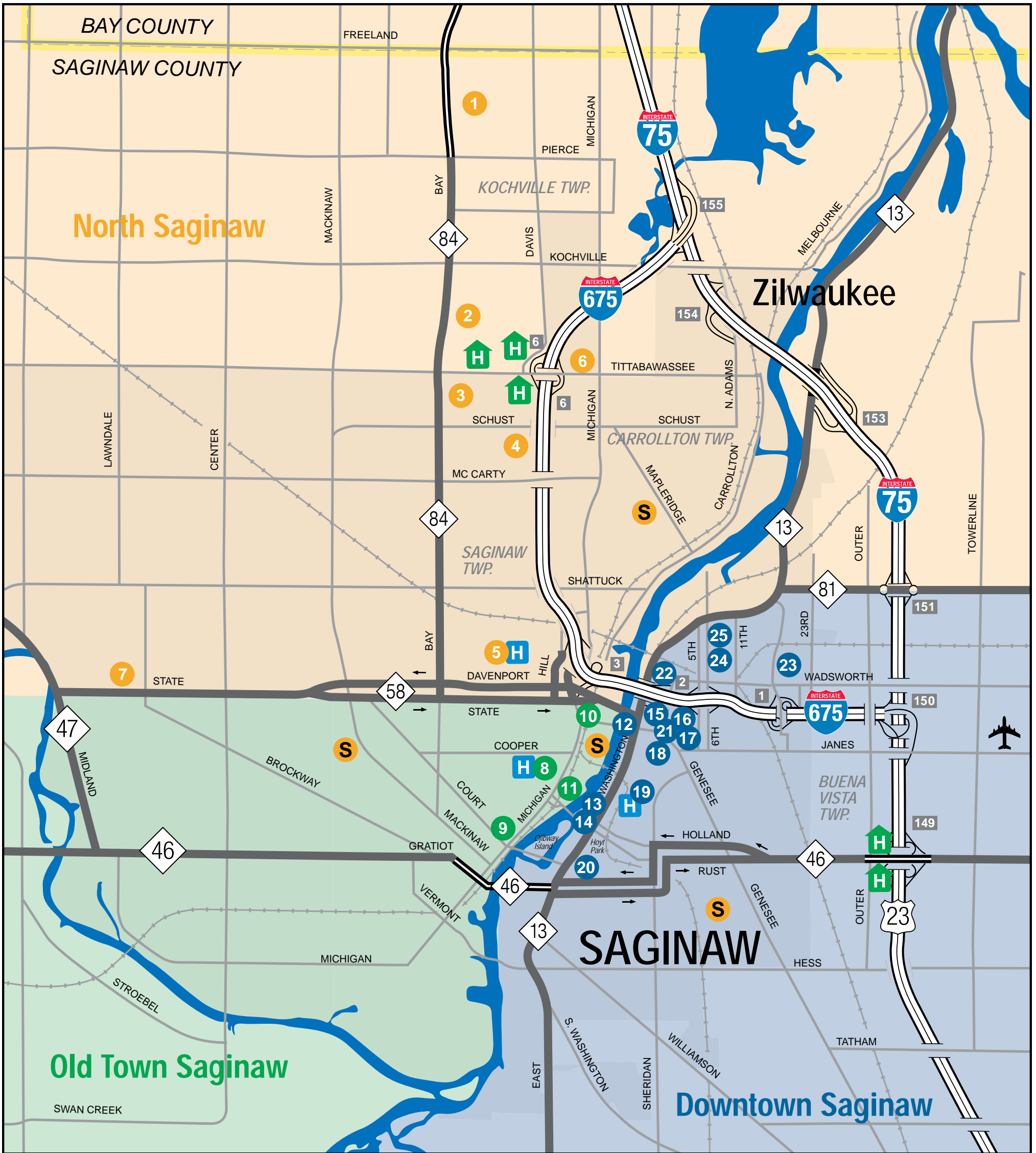
