

M-43 (Saginaw Street) Bridge Reconstruction over the Grand River

March 2012- September 2012

What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation will be reconstructing the M-43 (Saginaw Street) bridge over the Grand River. Work includes changing the five-lane roadway to four lanes between Washington Avenue and N. Cedar Street, widening sidewalks on both sides of the street from 5 feet to 8 feet, and improving the City of Lansing's River Trail. The trail will be widened from 7 feet to 10 feet, headroom will be improved under the bridge, and the path will be raised above the Grand River to minimize closures due to flooding.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

Saginaw Street will be closed with all traffic detoured. Eastbound M-43 traffic will be detoured up Grand Avenue across Oakland Avenue and then south on Center Street. Oakland Avenue will temporarily be converted to a two-way street between Grand Avenue and Center Street to accommodate the detour route.

When Will This Be Done?

Construction is scheduled to start in March 2012 and is expected to be complete by the Labor Day holiday. No work will take place during the annual Common Ground Music Festival in July 2012.
