**Question:** Is it required by MDOT that pre-qualified site investigation sub consultants (those that would conduct Phase II Environmental Assessments on individual properties) be formal members of the EORC team and named in the proposal prior to contract award and if that is the case would the successful EORC be limited to those named site investigation providers post award regardless of specific site needs/requirements?

**Answer:** All proposed subconsultants that are determined necessary should be included in the proposal. This ensures that all 'teams' are evaluated and fairly scored at the time of selection. If for some reason, an additional subconsultant is needed, it can be added through contract amendment, once all internal MDOT approvals are received, as well as the paperwork from the prime consultant.
