## What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is reconstructing 1 mile of US-2 in Ironwood, from Curry Street to Roosevelt Street. Work includes utility upgrades, sidewalks and construction of a center left-turn lane at the Lake Street signal.

## When Will This Be Done?

The project is scheduled to begin in May and be completed in October.

## How Will Traffic Be Affected?

This work will require a closure to through-traffic and a detour.

Westbound US-2 traffic will be detoured onto Jackson Road to Greenbush Street, then back to US-2. Eastbound US-2 traffic will remain on US-2 but will be restricted to one-way travel.

Motorists and residents are reminded that all businesses in the project area will remain open during construction. Parking is available along side streets or immediately behind many businesses. Access to businesses will be available at all times.

## Long-term Benefits

This project will extend the roadway's service life and improve ride quality, as well as improve safety and reduce maintenance costs. The city utility upgrades are expected to last 50 years.
