US-31 Reconstruction and Resurfacing

East Bay and Acme Townships

April - June and

What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will be reconstructing 1.5 miles of US-31 in East Bay Township, just east of Traverse City, from Three Mile Road to Holiday Road. This project includes replacing the roadway, replacing curb and gutter, improving drainage, interconnecting all sidewalks, and upgrading traffic signals.

MDOT also will be resurfacing about 3.5 miles of US-31 between Holiday Road and the Grand Traverse Resort (Brackett Road).

When Will This Be Done?

Reconstruction from Three Mile Road to Holiday Road is expected to begin April 7, as weather permits, and be completed before July 4. If construction is not complete by July 4, all traffic restrictions will be removed and construction will resume after Labor Day.

The resurfacing portion of this project, between Holiday Road and the Grand Traverse Resort, will begin after Labor Day and be completed by November.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

The reconstruction portion of this project will require lane closures, with one lane open in each direction throughout construction. Access to driveways and businesses will be maintained at all times. Delays are expected, with longer delays anticipated during peak traffic periods.

During the resurfacing project, one lane will remain open in each direction.

Long-term Benefits

When completed, this project will improve ride quality and appearance of the area, improve pedestrian convenience, and upgrade underground utilities.
