Dear Charitable Organization:

Re: Millionaire Party Educational Subordinate and Religious Subordinate Classifications

Your organization currently holds a classification as an educational subordinate or a religious subordinate organization for the purpose of holding licensed millionaire party events in the State of Michigan. **Effective March 1, 2014, the qualification classifications currently known as educational subordinate or religious subordinate will no longer be accepted qualification types.** The Act defines a "qualified organization" as a bona fide religious, educational, service, senior citizens', fraternal, or veterans' organization that operates without profit to its members and that either has been in existence continuously as an organization for a period of 5 years or is exempt from taxation under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, 26 USC 501. Subordinate organizations are not qualified organizations as defined by the Bingo Act.

To come into compliance with the requirement of the Bingo Act, you may apply to re-qualify. Many educational subordinate or religious subordinate organizations may meet the criteria to qualify as a local civic organization, a type of service organization.
