ADMINISTRATIVE RULES 2013-088-TY

The Michigan Gaming Control Board will conduct a public hearing at the following time and location to allow comment by interested persons on proposed changes to administrative rules.

The proposed rules are designed to license and regulate qualified organizations that may be permitted to conduct public gaming known as millionaire parties. The proposed rules also license and regulate suppliers of millionaire party equipment. The administrative rules previously governing the licensing and regulation of millionaire parties in the State of Michigan are obsolete and inconsistent with the intent of the Traxler-McCauley-Law-Bowman Bingo Act. The proposed rules are designed to ensure proper regulation of this public gaming and provide sufficient protection to the public, qualified organizations, and suppliers that participate in these events.

The hearing will be held to receive public comments concerning the proposed rules. These rules are promulgated by authority conferred on the Executive Director of the Michigan Gaming Control Board by Executive Order 2012-4 and under section 13 of the Bingo Act, MCL 432.1113. These rules become effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State unless adopted under sections 33, 44, or 45a(6) of 1969 PA 306. Rules adopted under these sections become effective 7 days after filing with the Secretary of State.
