
Dual Enrollment

To date, the Michigan Competitive Scholarship (MCS) program is over committed by \$800,000. The Michigan Tuition Grant (MTG) program is over committed by \$5 million. This is why it is critical that you accurately report the fall semester/term enrollment of your students.

It is vital that you reduce or de-obligate funds for students who are not full time or not attending term one. You can do this in two ways:

- 1. Go online and monitor individual student's awards.
- 2. Use the files sent to your DEG mailbox each Monday and complete column BI.

If you submit timely information and funds get back in good status, we may be able to make additional awards to students. The good news is that we are in better shape than we were at this time last year.

Verification Deadline

According to the SSG payment schedule posted on our Web site, the scheduled verification deadline for MCS/ MTG term one is **November 21, 2012**. However, due to the closures for the Thanksgiving holiday, you have until Monday, **November 26, 2012**, to submit your information. As term one is payable at 50%, it is critical that your institution submit data to ensure your payment of 50% of the aggregate owed.

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

We have received several questions regarding the State's stand on SAP. This is due to the latest federal changes in the SAP policy. Because SAP is a directive regarding appeals and probation which require the institution to implement specific actions and outcomes to continue to receive aid beyond probation, the State's policy will align with the institution. The institution may continue to award State aid to such a student who is placed on probation for the next semester/term with specific conditions for achieving a certain outcome.

Your institution will determine that they are under probation with an opportunity to work toward returning to a reasonable percent of progress. The State's policy is to follow your SAP policy. However, the student must be in compliance with your standard AND have at least a 2.0 GPA for MCS.






Working with SSG
