



Michigan Educational Opportunity Grant Fact Sheet



Description

The Michigan Educational Opportunity Grant (MEOG) is available for financially needy, undergraduate students enrolled at participating public postsecondary institutions. Eligible students must be enrolled at least half time at a public, degree-granting Michigan college or university.

Application

The State of Michigan allocates funding to the participating institutions and the institutions select students to receive MEOG awards. Students must file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The college's financial aid award letter is the means by which students are notified regarding eligibility.

When funds are insufficient to meet the needs of all eligible students, priority will be given to those students with the greatest financial need.

Program Limits

The current maximum award is \$1,000 per academic year. Future awards are subject to available and approved funding.

Eligibility

- Demonstrate financial need
- Enroll at least half time in a degree or certificate program at an approved public, degree-granting Michigan college or university
- Be a Michigan resident one year prior to beginning of enrollment
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Not be incarcerated
- For renewal, meet institution's satisfactory academic progress (SAP) policy
