INTRODUCTION

Certificate and Associate Degree Programs – Several of the universities provide less than baccalaureate degree programs for various occupations. These programs are found under the level 1 through 3 headings.


Undergraduate Baccalaureate Programs – This division includes all programs through which a baccalaureate degree can be earned (level 4 programs).
