Student Financial Services Bureau (SFSB)

We are excited to announce that the Michigan Department of Treasury has recognized the importance of student aid programs and has reestablished SFSB. The new bureau includes SSG, the Student Loan Programs division, which includes the Michigan Guaranty Agency (MGA), and the Michigan Education Trust (MET) division. Anne Wohlfert is the Acting Director of the bureau. Anne will continue to head the bureau and SSG until a new director for SSG is named. "We are pleased for the opportunity to form a stronger presence within the department as we work with our partners like MSFAA, MCAN, EduGuide, and others to bring information and resources to Michigan students and their families," Anne said. Michigan Competitive Scholarship (MCS)

Recently SSG sent high schools a list of students who achieved qualifying ACT scores, meeting the merit criteria for MCS consideration. Because the scholarship is based on merit and financial need, students with qualifying scores must file the FAFSA and demonstrate financial need at the college they plan to attend in order to receive a monetary award. The ACT exam no longer requires students to report their Social Security Number (SSN). Since the main identifier for FAFSA is the SSN, it is often hard to match records. SSG sent information to high schools to
