

# TWO- AND FOUR-YEAR COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES INTRODUCTION

There are many independent two- and four-year institutions in Michigan. Several of the schools have branch campuses, which increases the total number of separate sites across the state. These institutions offer a wide variety of educational programs. Programs offered at these institutions can be divided as follows:

**Certificate and Associate Degree Programs** – Several of the colleges and universities provide less than baccalaureate degree programs for various occupations. These programs are found under the level 1 through 3 programs.

**Church-Affiliated Terminal Programs** – Are found under level 1 programs.

**Undergraduate Baccalaureate Programs** – This division includes all programs through which a baccalaureate degree can be earned (level 4 programs).

**Graduate-Professional Programs** – These programs lead to post-baccalaureate degrees in the various professional disciplines (levels 5 through 9 programs).

In most cases, information is provided pertaining to the number of semester/term hours required to complete the program and whether a teaching certificate is available in conjunction with it.
