The Clinton Downtown Historic District encompasses several buildings that pre-date Michigan statehood, including some of the oldest brick buildings west of Detroit, a local government building that has functioned for over 125 years, a hotel built over a century ago that still offers rooms today, and, linking the village to the automotive component of the US-12 Heritage

Route, two buildings representing the initial influence of the automobile in Michigan. The village of Clinton sought the nomination. Property owners will now be eligible to apply for historic preservation tax credits for rehabilitation of historic structures in the district.
