Dear Service Supplier:

This letter has being sent to known service suppliers that may meet the criteria for billing and collecting Michigan 9-1-1 charges. The Michigan 9-1-1 Office is aware that not all service suppliers receiving this notice may provide service in Michigan, but given the ever-changing market, our office is sending this letter to the broadest industry group possible. If you are the point of contact for more than one service supplier, a separate form must be submitted for **each** of the providers you represent.

As set forth in Michigan statute, MCL 484.1102 (g) communication service is identified as:

A service capable of accessing, connecting with, or interfacing with a 9-1-1 system, exclusively through the numerals 9-1-1, by dialing, initializing, or otherwise activating the 9-1-1 system through the numerals 9-1-1 by means of a local telephone device, cellular telephone device, wireless communication device, interconnected voice over the internet device, or any other means.

Please indicate on the attached service supplier form if your company **provides service** in Michigan that meets the definition of a communication service under MCL 484.1102 (g). If your company **does not provide service** with the geographic boundaries of Michigan, please check the appropriate box in Section III B of the enclosed form. Return the form to our office using the postal or email address provided at the top of the form. The form can also be accessed on our web site [www.michigan.gov/snc](http://www.michigan.gov/snc) under Current Issues.

Service suppliers are required to provide this information in accordance with MCL 484.1201(4):

Each service supplier in this state is required to provide each of its service users access to the 9-1-1 system. Each service supplier shall provide the Committee with contact information to allow for notifications as required under Section 714.

The information provided will enable the State 9-1-1 office to provide notice to service suppliers of any changes in the Michigan 9-1-1 charges.
