Recognizing the problem.

- Teenagers and young adults are disproportionately involved in crashes.
- Motor vehicle crashes are the #1 cause of death for all persons in the 16-24 year old age group in the U.S. and Worldwide.

Recognizing the problem.

- Between 1995 and 2005 there was a 4% increase in teen driver fatalities.
- 85% of crashes that involved 16 year old drivers are attributed to “Driver Error”

Observations.

- The average 16 year old soccer player receives 1,500 hours of coached practice, but only 50 hours of driving experience before being given a license.
- When tracked “car control” graduates showed a 77% lower crash rate than non-graduates.

- The state of Florida along with the cities such as Atlanta, Cincinnati, and Birmingham; have experienced a decrease in crash rates over 20% with young drivers that have attended some type of driving clinic.

Program Goals

- Provide teen drivers with a program based on behavior modification.
- Provide a program that could prepare those students for real world driving.

Program Goals

- The training had to be “Hands On”
- Practice Like You Play
- Progressively harder keeping the students out of their comfort level.

Program Goals

- A tool to provide results with tracking the students driving.
- Remain accessible to the students.





“It’s definitely not drivers ed, It’s totally different”


