

**BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (BYRNE JAG) &
RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT (RSAT) AWARDS
SOUTHEAST
FISCAL YEAR 2012**

- O.M.N.I. #3 - Michigan Department of State Police - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$56,188 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Office of Monroe Narcotic Enforcement Team (O.M.N.I. III) is a multijurisdictional task force primarily responsible for investigations of mid- to high-level narcotics complaints in Lenawee and Hillsdale Counties. The task force regularly assists local agencies in their investigations of various felony-related crimes and partners with the probate courts and local/intermediate school districts in drug abuse prevention programs.
- D.R.A.N.O. - Michigan Department of State Police - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$146,840 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Downriver Area Narcotics Organization (D.R.A.N.O.) is a multijurisdictional task force that targets narcotics violators in the downriver area and surrounding source cities. D.R.A.N.O. works collaboratively with state, local and federal law enforcement agencies to identify drug trafficking organizations and use resources/personnel to disrupt, dismantal and arrest violators.
- C.O.M.E.T. - Michigan Department of State Police - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$195,874 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: County of Macomb Enforcement Team (C.O.M.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional task force operating in Macomb County and is comprised of enforcement officers from federal, state, county and local agencies. C.O.M.E.T.'s Narcotic and Conspiracy Crimes Team conducts investigations independently and in support of other criminal justice agencies in an effort to reduce the availability of illegal drugs and reduce violent crimes.
- N.E.T. - County of Oakland - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$242,176 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: The Oakland County Narcotic Enforcement Team (N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional task force that was created to encourage cooperation between law enforcement departments within southeast Michigan and other federal agencies. N.E.T. works cooperatively in an effort to apprehend and convict those involved in the use, sale and distribution of illegal drugs and narcotics.
- W.W.N. - Michigan Department of State Police - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$101,824 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Western Wayne Narcotics (W.W.N.) is multijurisdictional task force servicing 18 communities within western Wayne County. The enforcement efforts of this team focus on interrupting the flow of narcotics and assets by way of a holistic approach to narcotics enforcement and criminal surveillance.
- L.A.W.N.E.T. - Michigan Department of State Police - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$148,869 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Livingston and Washtenaw Narcotics Enforcement Team (L.A.W.N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional drug team with full-time narcotics enforcement, violent crime investigative support and auto theft related responsibilities for Livingston and Washtenaw Counties.

- St. Clair County Sheriff's Dept. - County of St. Clair - has been awarded RSAT funds in the amount of \$66,000 for Residential Substance Abuse Treatment.

Summary: St. Clair County proposes to provide an intensive cognitive behavioral treatment program designed addressing the substance abuse and criminal behavior of felony offenders during incarceration. Case management is provided as part of assessment, needs identification and re-entry planning. The three phases of the program include intensive education, therapeutic groups, individual sessions and re-entry.
- Canton Township Police Department - Township of Canton - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$22,050 for Evidence Based Efficiency Projects.

Summary: The Canton Township Police Department will purchase the Crime View Dashboard program. This software is the most efficient and effective means used to analyze crime, while addressing workforce reduction in this troubled economy.
- Farmington Department of Public Safety - City of Farmington - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$23,168 for Evidence Based Efficiency Projects.

Summary: The City of Farmington Department of Public Safety will purchase and install wireless color surveillance cameras to monitor the Sundquist Pavilion in Riley Park and the PlayScape area in Shiawassee Park.
- South Rockwood Police Department - Village of South Rockwood - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$8,550 for Evidence Based Efficiency Projects.

Summary: The South Rockwood Police Department's project will increase efficiency of evidence handling and property room management, while increasing officer safety and awareness by sharing collected data with local agencies. With this new technology, evidence handling and efficiency will improve by 75%, allowing additional patrol by officers.
- Crime Lab Unit - Michigan State Appellate Defender Office - has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$74,705 for Evidence Based Efficiency Projects.

Summary: The State Appellate Defender Office's (S.A.D.O.) "Sentencing Advocacy Project" will reduce recidivism through the use of evidence-based sentencing practices to achieve community correction placements and cut costs to the Michigan Department of Corrections. This project builds on the evidence-based successes of S.A.D.O.'s appellate advocacy in correcting legal errors that occur at sentencing.
- Pittsfield Township Department of Public Safety – Charter Township of Pittsfield has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$24,840 for Crime Mapping & Directed Patrol Policing.

Summary: Implementation of CrimeView Dashboard, an intelligence-led policing program that relies on data driven decisions put into visualizations that provide an instant snapshot of current (hot spot) activity. This allows for the rapid assessment and dissemination of critical information throughout the organization, in order to enhance proactive police decisions.
- Southfield Police Department – City of Southfield has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$25,290 for Crime Mapping & Directed Patrol Policing.

Summary: The goal of real time crime mapping is to capitalize on improved technologies to effectively direct proactive policing methods, which is particularly important when dealing with staff reductions. The Southfield Police Department will utilize the Omega Crime Mapping Dashboard which applies real time crime reporting technology to better direct our police officers.
