

**BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (BYRNE JAG) AWARDS &
RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT (RSAT) AWARDS
SOUTHEAST MI
FISCAL YEAR 2013**

- Allen Park Police Department - City of Allen Park has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$50,000 for Data Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety.
Summary: Allen Park Police Department will conduct high visibility enforcements at Fairlane Green and Independence Marketplace shopping centers to deter larceny and control traffic in an effort to reduce crime, traffic accidents, and related violations.
- Detroit Police Department - City of Detroit has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$50,000 for Data Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety.
Summary: The "Detroit Police Department's Data Driven Approach to Crime and Traffic Safety Project" will involve targeted enforcement of traffic violations and criminal activity at high-risk locations in the City of Detroit. Outreach activities will be conducted to engage the public and stakeholders. Wayne State University will partner with the Detroit Police to support planning, development, and evaluation of activities.
- Wayne State University Department of Public Safety - Wayne State University has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$50,000 for Data Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety.
Summary: Wayne State University is seeking support for Midtown CompStat, a data-driven crime-fighting strategy that targets crime hot spots and coordinates crime prevention with several agencies. With this project, the targeting of crime hot spots will be enhanced through high visibility traffic enforcement and the grant will also support new efforts targeting repeat offenders.
- Port Huron Police Department - City of Port Huron has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$50,000 for Data Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety.
Summary: The Port Huron Police Department will engage in a data-based project to reduce crime and traffic crashes. The project (Operation TCR) will employ officers in an overtime capacity to focus on problem areas that are determined based on criminal and traffic statistics.
- Detroit Police Department - City of Detroit has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$100,000 for Juvenile-Focused Community Policing/Community Prosecution.
Summary: This Project seeks to enhance prevention/intervention efforts in the Cody High School neighborhood through a collaboration between Think Detroit PAL and the Detroit Police Department. Activities will be targeted to youth (10-16) and include sports, mentoring, and life skills education. 750 youth at risk of dropping out of school, joining a gang or engaging in illicit behavior will be reached.
- O.M.N.I. #3 - Michigan Department of State Police has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$50,060 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: The Office of Monroe Narcotics Investigations (O.M.N.I.) III Team is responsible for investigating narcotics-related complaints, with their primary focus to target mid- to high-level drug dealers in the counties of Lenawee and Hillsdale. The team also collaborates regularly with other local agencies to assist with the investigation and prevention of all types of crime.
- D.R.A.N.O. - Michigan Department of State Police has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$122,580 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: The Downriver Area Narcotics Organization (D.R.A.N.O.) is a multijurisdictional task force that has been in existence since April, 1972. D.R.A.N.O. targets narcotics violators in the downriver area and surrounding cities. The task force works with state, local, and federal law enforcement agencies to identify drug trafficking organizations and uses resources and personnel to disrupt, dismantle and arrest violators.

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- C.O.M.E.T. - Michigan Department of State Police has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$161,808 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: C.O.M.E.T. is a multijurisdictional task force comprised of enforcement officers from federal, state, county, and local agencies working to disrupt drug-related criminal activities in Macomb County.
- N.E.T. - County of Oakland has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$198,850 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: The Oakland County Narcotic Enforcement Team (N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional task force that was created to encourage cooperation between law enforcement departments within southeast Michigan and other federal agencies. N.E.T. works cooperatively in an effort to apprehend and convict those involved in the use, sale, and distribution of illegal drugs and narcotics.
- W.W.N. - Michigan Department of State Police has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$86,570 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Western Wayne Narcotics' (W.W.N.) focus is disrupting drug trafficking, production, and combating/ eradicating drug crimes and the subsequent crimes associated with them. Through cooperative efforts with law enforcement at multiple levels of jurisdiction, W.W.N. vigorously works to identify and arrest persons associated with drug-related offenses.
- L.A.W.N.E.T. - Michigan Department of State Police has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$124,245 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Livingston and Washtenaw Narcotics Enforcement Team (L.A.W.N.E.T.) is a multijurisdictional drug enforcement concept with full-time narcotics enforcement and auto theft related responsibilities for Livingston and Washtenaw Counties.
- St. Clair County Sheriff's Department - County of St. Clair has been awarded RSAT funds in the amount of \$50,000 for Residential Substance Abuse Treatment.
Summary: St. Clair County proposes to provide an intensive cognitive behavioral treatment program addressing the substance abuse and criminal behavior of felony offenders during their incarceration. Case management is provided for needs identification and re-entry planning. The three phases of the program include Intensive Education, Therapeutic Groups and Re-entry.
