

Western Wayne Auto Theft Team detectives have arrested Gavin VanLavelle Harrison, 22 years of age, of Detroit and Kimberly Patrice Adams, 33 years of age, also of Detroit. They are believed to have been involved in the theft of fourteen 2006 Lincoln Mark LT and Ford F-150 pickup trucks stolen from a Ford Motor Company storage lot in Dearborn between February 13 and March 5, 2006. The vehicles were valued at \$564,274.

The Wayne County Prosecutor's Office Auto Theft Unit authorized warrants against Mr. Harrison and Ms. Adams for their involvement in the thefts.

On January 23, 2007, Mr. Harrison surrendered himself to authorities and was arraigned on 14 counts of Receiving and Concealing Stolen Property over \$20,000; 14 counts of Unlawfully Driving Away an Auto (UDAA), and 14 counts of Intent to Pass False Title. On January 18, Ms. Adams was arrested and arraigned on two counts of Identity Theft; one count of Receiving and Concealing Stolen Property over \$20,000; one count of Possession of a Stolen, False, or Forged Registration plate; and one count of Possession of a Counterfeit Insurance Certificate.

"We have been working with the Western Wayne Auto Theft Team to aggressively prosecute these cases. The effect of this type of crime literally costs hundreds of thousands of dollars each year," said Wayne County Prosecutor Kym L. Worthy. "A theft from Ford Motor Company is not a victimless crime; it is also a theft from our community."
