

- **Alger County Sheriff's Department** has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$12,183 for Technology Enhancement Projects.
Summary: The Alger County Sheriff's Department will install video arraignment equipment at the courthouse in Alger County and at the Alger County Sheriff's Department. This will allow for arraignments without moving inmates from one facility to another, and will provide needed manpower relief to all three police departments within Alger County, along with court staff.
- **Delta County Sheriff's Department** has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$14,544 for Technology Enhancement Projects.
Summary: The Delta County Sheriff's Department will purchase an upgraded livescan that will allow palmprints to be transmitted electronically to the AFIS system for immediate identification and background information.
- **Gogebic County Sheriff's Department** has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$13,430 for Technology Enhancement Projects.
Summary: The Gogebic County Jail will purchase for surveillance cameras, computers, computer software and security locks. This equipment will increase and enhance jail security, crime reporting systems and records management. The jail serves all law enforcement agencies in Gogebic County.
- **Hancock Police Department** has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$12,173 for Technology Enhancement Projects.
Summary: The Hancock Police Department will install security cameras within and around the department to provide greater security when the building is unstaffed.
- **Houghton County Sheriff's Department** has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$13,485 for Technology Enhancement Projects.
Summary: The Houghton County Sheriff's Department will replace their central file server, two workstations and upgrade existing digital mugshot equipment. They will also procure a multimedia projector and laptop for training and education of staff, community education, crime prevention and public presentations.

- **Houghton Police Department** has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$14,734 for Technology Enhancement Projects.
Summary: The Houghton Police Department will purchase a digital state-of-the-art audio/video recording system for the purpose of recording interviews of suspects. The system will have the capacity to store the recorded interviews digitally and retrieve interviews for transcription, when necessary.
- **U.P.S.E.T. - Michigan Department of State Police** has been awarded Byrne JAG funds in the amount of \$337,980 for Multijurisdictional Task Forces.
Summary: Upper Peninsula Substance Enforcement Team (U.P.S.E.T.) investigates mid- and upper-level narcotic traffickers utilizing undercover operations, surveillance, informant and intelligence information received from other agencies. U.P.S.E.T. prevents illicit drugs from reaching street-level dealers.
