Evidence Retrieval from Digital Video Recorders

The Michigan State Police Training Academy is hosting a one-day seminar on retrieving digital video evidence from a digital video recorder (DVR). The class will be instructed by members of the Michigan State Police (MSP) Audio/Video Analysis Unit.

This course teaches the fundamentals needed for understanding basic digital video recorder video data extraction. The course is geared toward any investigator that handles surveillance video or is requested to download from a DVR.

Attendees will learn the following:

- What is a DVR?
- What is DVR extraction?
- Terminology
- Proper planning, preparation and extraction, and extraction kit
- Requirements for court

At the completion of this training, there will be a written examination, and students will receive a certificate of completion.
