### Digital Photography for the First Responder

Digital Photography for the First Responder is a 4-hour course designed to train police officers in the proper use of compact point-and-shoot digital cameras to best document injuries, accident scenes, crime scenes, disasters, and other emergency situations. This course does not provide detailed crime scene/evidentiary photographic principles and techniques. Officers will learn capabilities, controls, and modes of operation for point-and-shoot digital cameras. At the end of this course, the officer will have learned the following:

- Significance of digital imaging verses film to law enforcement
- Familiarization with their equipment, maximizing camera features, pre-patrol equipment preparation, and use of incident identification cards and shooting logs
- How to ensure images are in-focus and are properly exposed, images are properly lit, what to photograph and document on first arrival, how to store and protect the images, the importance of establishing and following a digital workflow, and much more
- The importance of digital image integrity and essential department policies to ensure digital image integrity is maintained will be discussed

**\*Please note this class is for compact point-and-shoot cameras—it is NOT a class for digital single lens reflex (DSLR) cameras.**

**EQUIPMENT:** Students will be required to bring the following items to class:

- Department digital camera and camera manual
- Current policies for photography or digital image integrity
- Any accessories available, such as tripods, external lighting, etc.
