**Eligibility for Severe Need Rate Determination**

Eligibility for severe need rate is re-calculated each year beginning with the October claim. This calculation is based on the following percentages of free and reduced price lunches served relative to total lunches served. The 1999-2000 school year will be used to determine eligibility for October 2001 through September 2002.

**Lunch Determination:**

Sixty percent (60%) or more lunches were served free or at a reduced price *district wide* in the second preceding school year (1999-2000).

**Breakfast Determination:**

Forty percent (40%) or more lunches were served free or at a reduced price *per building* in the second preceding school year (1999-2000).
