FROM: Michigan Department of State, Bureau of Elections
SUBJECT: Administration of the Campaign Finance Act

A review of the duties all county clerks must perform under Section 16 of Michigan's Campaign Finance Act is provided below. A listing of the resources provided through the Michigan Department of State's Bureau of Elections to assist county clerks with the performance of the duties is also provided.

A supply of the 2009 Campaign Finance Dates to Remember cards and a supply of the CFR Forms on the Internet! postcards are enclosed. Please feel free to contact us if you would like an additional supply of these publications.

Please do not hesitate to contact the Bureau if you have any questions.

Notice of Failure to File: The county clerk is responsible for determining whether a statement or report that is required to be filed under the Michigan Campaign Finance Act is, in fact, filed. All county clerks are required to review their records and determine if any candidate or committee that was required to file a report failed to do so. A candidate or committee that fails to file a required report must be sent a "Notice of Failure to File" within four (4) business days after the elapse of the report due date.

Notice of Error or Omission: The county clerk is responsible for determining whether a statement or report filed under the Michigan Campaign Finance Act complies, on its face, with the requirements of the Act. In order to make this determination, a review must be performed for errors or omissions. If it is determined that the report contains errors or omissions, a "Notice of Error or Omission" must be forwarded to the filer. The submission of a response to the Notice of Error or Omission is required within nine (9) business days after the date of the Notice.

Late Filing Fee Notice: If a Statement of Organization, Campaign Statement or Late Contribution Report is filed late, the committee is subject to late filing fees. The county clerk is required to compute the number of days the report was filed after the filing deadline, indicate the late filing fee assessment on the "Late Filing Fee Notice," and notify the committee of the late filing fee assessment.

The forms may be copied and filled out as appropriate or you may use the wording from the Notices to produce your own versions.

Copies of Campaign Statements Available on the Internet: Section 36 of the Act directs the Secretary of State to reproduce certain Campaign Statements and transmit the reproduction to the county clerk. In compliance with the requirement, all of the Campaign Statements filed with the Bureau of Elections are posted on the Internet.
