

APPENDIX D-6A EXPIRATION OF DRIVER SKILLS TEST CERTIFICATES

The *Driver Skills Test Certificate* (TPT-010) is preprinted with instructions indicating a certificate is valid for one year from date of issuance. In preparation for the Business Application Modernization (BAM) program, the period of validity is being shortened.

It will be necessary for examiners to cross out the reference to the one year validity, to enter an expiration and to advise customers of this change in procedure. In most cases, the certificate will be valid for 60 days from the date of issuance. For teens testing before their 16th birthday, though, the certificate will be valid for 60 days after their 16th birthday.

APPLICANTS MORE THAN 16 YEARS OF AGE

Before issuing the certificate, the examiner must cross out “one year” and write below it “60 DAYS” (Figure 1). The examiner must tell the customer that the certificate must be converted at a Secretary of State branch office within 60 days. The certificate will become invalid after that date.

APPLICANTS LESS THAN 16 YEARS OF AGE

Before issuing the certificate, the examiner must cross out “for one year from date of issuance” and write below it “UNTIL” and the date falling 60 days after the customer’s 16th birthday (Figure 2). The examiner must tell the customer that the certificate must be converted at a Secretary of State branch office within 60 days after the customer’s 16th birthday. The certificate will become invalid after that date.
