SUBJECT: Three-Wheeled Motorcycle Policy - Slingshot

The Polaris Slingshot has some features of an autocycle, but under current Michigan law, the Slingshot—and any similar vehicle—is classified as a three-wheeled motorcycle. Therefore, any person operating one must have a motorcycle endorsement.

The Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) current policy is that the Three-Wheeled Basic Rider Course (3WBRC) does not accommodate the Slingshot body style. Therefore, the Michigan Motorcycle Rider Training Program will <u>not</u> accept the Polaris Slingshot, and any similar vehicle, in the 3WBRC's offered at our program sites.

If a customer contacts you to obtain their motorcycle endorsement on this type of vehicle, please inform them that they will need to take a skills test through a Third Party Testing Organization. For more information about the skills test, customers can be directed to the department web page at www.michigan.gov/motorcycletest.

A person using the Slingshot for the skills test would qualify for a motorcycle endorsement with a restriction limited to operation of a three-wheeled motorcycle (including a Slingshot).
