Michigan's Workforce Development Board



The Governor's Talent Investment Board (GTIB) serves as Michigan's Workforce Development Board as required by the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) of 2014, Public Law 113-128, 29 USCS 3101 et seq.

GTIB Composition



27 members including:

- 14 private sector members
- 1 member of the MI Senate (appointed by Lt. Governor)
- 1 members of the House (appointed by the House Speaker)
- 3 representatives of organized labor
- 1 representative of organized labor representing joint labor management apprentice program
- 1 representative with youth activity experience
- 2 Chief Elected Officials of local government
- 1 Michigan Works! Agency representative
- 1 State Agency Director representing the Rehabilitation Act
- 1 State Agency Director representing core programs

Executive Committee Composition: Chair, Vice Chair, standing committee chairs

Responsibilities:

- Provides direction to Board activities
- Reviews regulatory items prior to full Board review
- Takes action when time does not allow for full board review

All actions of the Executive Committee are reviewed by the full Board



Standing Committees:

- Youth
 - Skill based
 - Governance

Charge to the Board



Created by Executive Order 2015-11, the Governor's Talent Investment Board (GTIB) is charged with advising the Governor regarding compliance with the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 and overall talent development in Michigan.

GTIB Responsibilities



GTIB provides oversight of Michigan's talent system, including:

- Unified Statewide Talent Plan for Michigan
- Adoption of industry and sector partner strategies to meet demand
- Implementation of a Statewide Career Pathway strategy
- Adoption on High Performing Board criteria, review and approval of the state One-Stop system
- Advocating and promoting Michigan's Talent System
- Oversight of funding, reporting and performance outcomes



First Year Priorities



- **Compliance regarding implementation of new legislation**
- **Local board oversight**
- **Apprenticeship strategy**
- **Credentials**
- **Career pathway strategies**



GTIB Member General Responsibilities



- Engage in and attend GTIB quarterly meetings
- Learn about the law that governs the GTIB
- Reach out to your local counterparts
- Get to know your local MWA Director, Michigan Works! Service Center staff and service providers
- Act as an ambassador of workforce policy for the Governor and the state
- Practice patience because the public workforce system is complex and not always rational!

Creation of MI Department of Talent and Economic Development



- Consists of new Talent Investment Agency (TIA), MSF/MEDC and MI State Housing Development Authority


TED CULTURE WHEEL
