



## MI School Data News and Updates

### **MI School Data User Migration**

In summer 2020, all MI School Data secure users will need a [third party MILogin account](#) with the same email address as their current MI School Data account to access secure data. Users who don't already have this type of MILogin account must create one prior to the migration to retain access to secure data. If this is not done prior to the migration, users will need to fill out a security form and request a new account. Please refer to the [MILogin/MI School Data Instructions](#) for information on how to set up your MILogin account now to ensure continued access to your data.

### **Recently Updated in Preview**

- Data for 2018-19 showing transfer patterns, demographics and performance data for students who transferred into or out of a Michigan college or university have been added to the [College Transfers](#) report.
- The [College Undergraduate Enrollment](#) report offers a closer look at the undergraduate classes of Michigan's colleges and universities, including the number of degree-seeking students, student age, and whether students graduated from a Michigan public high school the year prior to enrollment. The report has been updated with 2018-19 data.
- The [Kindergarten Count](#) report shows the publicly funded early childhood education programs in which students were enrolled before entering kindergarten, such as *Early On*®, Early Childhood Special Education, Great Start Readiness Program, Head Start and GSRP/Head Start Blend. The report has been updated with 2019-20 data.
- Pupil headcount data for the 2019-20 school year have been added to the [Student Count](#) report. The report shows an unduplicated count of students attending a specific district or school.

- The following reports have been updated with 2018-19 postsecondary data for high school graduation years 2017-18 and prior:
  - The [24 College Credits](#) report shows the amount of time Michigan public high school graduates take to accumulate 24 college credits
  - The [College Enrollment by High School](#) report shows the number of Michigan public high school graduates who enrolled in a college or university.
  - [College Enrollment Destination](#) data show the colleges and universities where public high school students enrolled.
  - Student progression in postsecondary education after high school graduation is shown in the [College Progression by Graduating Class](#) report.
  - The [College Remedial Coursework](#) shows the number of Michigan public high school graduates who took at least one remedial course after enrolling in a Michigan college or university the year after high school graduation.

### Coming Soon

- School of choice and other resident statuses for traditional and charter districts will be updated with 2019-20 data in the [Non-Resident Status](#) report.
- The [Retained in Grade](#) report, which shows counts and percentages of students who were enrolled in the same grade level for two consecutive years, will be updated with fall 2019-20 data.
- 2018-19 Secondary CTE Program data have been added to the [Student Pathways](#) report. This report provides secondary CTE program enrollment history only for the students who have enrolled in a college or university as of the 2009-10 school year.
