Disabled American Veterans Salt City Chapter 43 Scholarship Fund

To provide financial assistance to residents of Manistee County, Michigan who have a tie to Disabled American Veterans (DAV) and are interested in attending college in any state.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to graduating seniors, nontraditional students, and college students who are residents of Manistee County, Michigan or graduates of a Manistee County high school. Applicants must be attending or planning to attend an accredited 2- or 4-year college, university, or vocational/technical school in any state. They must be veterans or the child or grandchild of a veteran. Selection is based on academic performance and financial need. Preference may be given to members of DAV or to the children and grandchildren of DAV members. Preference may also be given to children and grandchildren of members of other veterans' organizations (e.g., Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion).

Military Intelligence Corps Association Scholarships

To provide financial assistance for college to members of the Military Intelligence Corps Association (MICA) and their immediate family.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to active-duty, Reserve, National Guard, and retired military intelligence soldiers who are MICA members and to their immediate family (spouses, children, or other relatives living with and supported by the MICA member). Applicants must be attending or accepted for attendance at an accredited college, university, vocational school, or technical institution. Along with their application, they must submit a 1-page essay on their educational goals and program of study. Financial need is not considered in the selection process.

Army Women's Foundation Legacy Scholarships

To provide financial assistance for college or graduate school to women who are serving or have served in the Army and their children.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to 1) women who have served or are serving honorably in the U.S. Army, U.S. Army Reserve, or Army National Guard; and 2) children of those women. Applicants must be 1) high school graduates or GED recipients enrolled at a community college or technical certificate program who have a GPA of 2.5 or higher; 2) sophomores or higher at an accredited college or university who have a GPA of 3.0 or higher; or 3) students enrolled in or accepted to a graduate program who have a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Along with their application, they must submit a 2-page essay on why they should be considered for this scholarship; their future plans as related to their program of study; their community service, activities, and work experience; and how the Army has impacted their life and/or goals. Selection is based on merit, academic potential, community service, and financial need.

To provide financial assistance to ROTC cadets or midshipmen who are majoring in engineering, architecture, construction management, or a related science at a college in the area served by the Detroit Post of the Society of American Military Engineers (SAME).

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to ROTC cadets or midshipmen who are sophomores or juniors at a college or university in the area of the SAME Detroit Post (the entire state of Michigan and Toledo, Ohio). Applicants must be working on a bachelor's degree in engineering, architecture, construction management, or a related science. Along with their nomination form, they must submit a 1-page statement describing their scholastic and career goals. Selection is based on that statement (30 points); academic record and the nature of the course load (30 points); ROTC class ranking (10 points); recommendation from ROTC staff adviser (10 points); experience in wage-earning or volunteer employment (10 points); participation in academic, business, or social organizations, committees, societies, and activities (20 points); and academic honors and awards (10 points). U.S. citizenship is required.

Rosamond P. Haeberle Memorial Scholarship

To provide financial assistance to Michigan veterans and military personnel interested in attending college in the state.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to residents of Michigan who have served on active duty in the U.S. armed forces (including Reserves and National Guard) for at least 6 continuous months and are either currently serving in the armed forces or have received a separation from active duty under honorable conditions. Applicants must be currently accepted to and/or enrolled at a 2- or 4-year accredited college, university, or trade/technical school in Michigan. They must be enrolled at least half time and have a cumulative high school or undergraduate GPA of 2.5 or higher. Along with their application, they must submit a 1-page essay on what serving their country has meant to them and how it has influenced their future goals and priorities. Selection is based on academic performance, extracurricular activities, community service, potential to succeed in an academic environment, financial need, and military service record.

Women's Army Corps Veterans' Association Scholarship

To provide financial assistance for college to the relatives of Army military women.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to high school seniors who are the children, grandchildren, nieces, or nephews of Army service women. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher and be planning to enroll full time at an accredited college or university in the United States. They must submit a 500-word biographical sketch that includes their future goals and how the scholarship would be used. Selection is based on academic achievement, leadership ability as expressed through co-curricular activities and community involvement, the biographical sketch, and recommendations. Financial need is not considered. U.S. citizenship is required.

To provide financial assistance for college to children and grandchildren of members of the Second Indianhead Division Association.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to 1) children and grandchildren of veterans who have been members of the association for the past 3 years and have a current membership; and 2) children and grandchildren of men or women killed in action while serving with the Second Division. Applicants may be high school seniors or currently-enrolled college students. They must submit a personal letter giving reasons for the request and plans for the future; a high school and, if appropriate, college transcript; ACT or SAT test scores; a statement from their school principal attesting to their character and involvement in extracurricular activities; 2 letters of recommendation from current teachers or professors; a 200- to 300-word essay on such subjects as "What Being an American Means to Me," "Why I Should Receive This Scholarship," or "What Significant Part of U.S. Army History Has the Second Infantry Division Contributed;" and a statement from their parents or guardians on the financial support they will be able to provide the applicant.

Living parents must have a Veterans Affairs disability rating of 60% or more or active duty equivalent.

Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance Program

To provide financial assistance for undergraduate or graduate study to children and spouses of deceased and disabled veterans, MIAs, and POWs.

ELIGIBILITY

Eligible for this assistance are spouses and children of 1) veterans who died or are permanently and totally disabled as the result of active service in the armed forces; 2) veterans who died from any cause while rated permanently and totally disabled from a service-connected disability; 3) servicemembers listed as missing in action or captured in the line of duty by a hostile force; 4) servicemembers listed as forcibly detained or interned by a foreign government or power; and 5) servicemembers who are hospitalized or receiving outpatient treatment for a service-connected permanent and total disability and are likely to be discharged for that disability. Children must be between 18 and 26 years of age, although extensions may be granted. Spouses and children over 14 years of age with physical or mental disabilities are also eligible.

Benefits are provided for up to 45 months (or the equivalent in part-time training). Some beneficiaries who qualify for more than 1 education program may be eligible for up to 81 months. Spouses must complete their training within 10 years of the date they are first found eligible. For spouses of servicemembers who died on active duty, benefits end 20 years from the date of death.

ADDITIONAL INFO

Benefits may be used to work on associate, bachelor's, or graduate degrees at colleges and universities, including independent study, cooperative training, and study abroad programs. Courses leading to a certificate or diploma from business, technical, or vocational schools may also be taken. Other eligible programs include apprenticeships, on-the-job training programs, farm cooperative courses, and correspondence courses (for spouses only). Remedial, deficiency, and refresher courses may be approved under certain circumstances.

Freedom Alliance Scholarships

To provide financial assistance for college to the children of deceased and disabled military personnel.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to high school seniors, high school graduates, and undergraduate students under 26 years of age who are dependent children of military personnel (soldier, sailor, airman, Marine, or Guardsman). The military parent must 1) have been killed or permanently disabled as a result of an operational mission or training accident; or 2) be currently classified as a POW or MIA. For disabled parents, the disability must be permanent, service-connected, and rated at 100% by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Applicants must submit a 500-word essay on what their parent's service means to them.

Children of Warriors National Presidents' Scholarship

To provide financial assistance for college to the descendants of war veterans.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to children, stepchildren, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren of veterans who served during wartime. Applicants must be high school seniors who have completed at least 50 hours of volunteer service within their community and plan to attend an accredited 4-year college or university. Each Department (state) organization of the American Legion Auxiliary nominates 1 candidate for this scholarship annually. Nominees must submit a true, 500-word essay on a topic that changes annually; recently, students were asked to write on "How Military Families Are Keeping the Promise to Preserve our Freedom." Selection is based on the essay (25%), character and leadership (25%), scholarship, (25%), and financial need (25%).

ThanksUSA Scholarships

To provide financial assistance for college to children and spouses of military personnel who served after September 11, 2001.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to dependent children 24 years of age or younger and spouses of active-duty military personnel. The parent or spouse must 1) have served on active duty for at least 180 days since September 11, 2001; 2) have been killed or wounded in action since that date; 3) be a member of the military Reserves activated to full-time duty; or 4) be a member of the National Guard who have been federalized. Children and spouses of retired or discharged service personnel are eligible if the parent or spouse served 180 days after September 11, 2011. Applicants must be entering or attending an accredited 2- or 4-year college, university, vocational school, or technical school as a full-time student. Spouses may use the award for non-degree licensure or certification programs and may enroll part time. All applicants must have a GPA of 2.0 or higher. Selection is based on financial need, academic record, a statement of goals, and demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities. Preference is given to children or spouses of service personnel killed or injured during active duty.

Daedalian Foundation Descendants' Scholarship Program

To provide financial assistance to descendants of members of the Order of Daedalians who wish to prepare for a career in military aviation or space.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is open to descendants of members of the order who are working on or planning to work on a baccalaureate or higher degree. Applicants must be interested in and willing to commit to a career as a commissioned military pilot, flight crew member, astronaut, or commissioned officer in 1 of the armed forces of the United States in a discipline directly supporting aeronautics or astronautics.
