FUNDING TO CLEAN UP THOUSANDS OF CONTAMINATED SITES STATEWIDE



The nearly depleted 1998 CMI bond funded \$675 million of contaminated site remediation and environmental activities

There are 14 confirmed sites in Michigan with emerging PFAS contaminant issues CAUTION

EXISTING SOLID WASTE TIPPING FEES

The current CMI bond leaves our kids with debt while burdening taxpayers with a 50% markup totaling over \$1 billion in costs for the bond

The cost of Gov. Snyder's proposal would be about \$4.75 per household, per year

- Increase asbestos removal oversight for blighted communities

3. RECYCLING GRANTS TO TRIPLE MICHIGAN'S RECYCLING RATE

4. WATER QUALITY MONITORING GRANTS
