I. CALL TO ORDER AND DETERMINATION OF QUORUM:

The MMFTC October Work Session meeting was called to order at 1:11 p.m. by Chad Tackett. It was determined that a quorum was not needed for the work sessions given the nature of the work session.

II. NEW BUSINESS:

- a. State Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer shared that the Bureau of Fire Service needs help from the MFFTC members to help develop the policies, procedures and the rules. MFFTC members worked on the framework for the rules
- b. Discussion on Fire Officer I per NFPA 1021
 Must be a NFPA Fire Instructor I
 Pass the Fire Officer Exam
 Must have Fire Fighter II

Must have Hazmat Ops Fire Officer I NFPA 1021 (MUST HAVE 3 YEARS OF SERVICE)

- c. It was determined that the years of service with the Fire Service would begin with the start date entered in the SMOKE System.
- d. It was determined that a definition for equivalency would need to be determined. One idea presented was all MFFTC Fire Officer Series Certificates issued after October 1, 1988 will have equivalency to count towards meeting requirements to take Fire Officer Classes after October 1, 2019. Further discussion is needed.
- e. All Fire Officers I certification must have NFPA 1041 Fire Instructor I per NFPA 1021
- f. Students must take firefighter I or firefighter II to take Driver's Training For a person to drive they must complete the Driver Training course and their Fire Chief must checks the box in SMOKE.
- g. Ideas for moving forward with Fire Officer Certifications: Fire Instructor I – 3 years of service Estimate length of course 24 hours Pass written exam / Pass practical eval with training coordinator Can teach FF I & II Driver's Training and Hazmat Ops
- Fire Instructor II 5 years of service
 Estimated at 34-40 hours

 Pass written exam
 Pass practical evaluation with training coordinator
 Teach Any course they have passed
- Fire Instructor III 7-10 years of service
 Course hours need further evaluation
 Pass written exam
 Pass practical exam with training coordinator
- j. The topic of Continuing Education (CE) was brought up. SFM Sehlmeyer shared as he has been out at different functions in the state the feedback he is receiving regarding CE is that a majority of people want a three (3) year process similar to EMS cycle. SFM Sehlmeyer asked the MFFTC members to go back to their memberships and ask about supporting the three-year process. Further SFM Sehlmeyer shared that some formula is needed since many people

hold many classifications and there will need to be a cross-over where credits count for more than one classification.
