COMMITTEE REPORTS

Allegation Review Committee

PA 161 Update

Ms. Suddeth directed the Board to the July PA 161 update. She provided the current information for July as follows:

Disciplinary Subcommittee

Hale reported that the Disciplinary Subcommittee (DSC) had 5 Consent Order and Stipulations, 2 Orders of Dismissal, and 1 Proposal for Decision. The matters will be discussed at the DSC meeting immediately following the conclusion of the full Board meeting.

Ad/Hoc Committee on Anesthesia

Schmakel reported that the last update to the rules pertaining to anesthesia was in 2003. Schmakel stated that the rules should be updated to comply with the 2016 ADA updates.

Ditschman will have an updated copy of the rules, including the 2016 ADA standards, at the next Board meeting. She will review the statute prior to making the changes to verify if the Board has the authority to make the suggested changes.

CDCA Committee Report

Weidig provided the Board with a brief summary of what the CDCA does. The CDCA had their mid-year meeting on July 12.

It has been announced that the CDCA now has 29 member jurisdictions. As of spring, 2017, Arizona and Minnesota have joined.

Arkansas now accepts all of the ADEX examinations. Minnesota now accepts the ADEX dental and dental hygiene exams.

The next annual CDCA meeting will be held on January 11, 2018 through January 13, 2018. The meeting will be held at Walt Disney World's Disney Yacht Club.

Chairperson's Report

Kaysserian thanked the Department staff for all of their patience and assistance when helping with the Board.

Kaysserian also thanked Hines for having created a guideline binder for both the Chair and Vice Chair.

PA 161 of 2005: Public Dental Prevention Programs in Public Health

- 1978 PA 368-Public Health Code
 - Amended by PA 58 of 1991
 - October 5, 2005 - Governor Granholm signed Public Act 161 of 2005
- PA 161 of 2005
 - Public or nonprofit entity, or a school or nursing home, that administers a program of dental care to a dentally underserved population
 - Employ or contract with at least 1 dentist and 1 dental hygienist
 - A dental hygienist may perform dental hygiene services under the supervision of a dentist as part of a program for dentally underserved populations in this state conducted by a local, state, or federal grantee health agency for patients who are not assigned by a dentist

Role of PA161: Public Dental Prevention Programs in Public Health

PA 161 of 2005

- Public or nonprofit entity that administers a program of dental care to a dentally underserved population
- Allows RDHs to work in non-traditional settings to provide preventive dental services
- Primary role—prevention and oral health promotion
- Secondary role—collaboration and referral for treatment needs

Medicaid Provider Status January, 2011

- MDHHS allows RDHs to enroll as a Medicaid provider and submit claims for reimbursement

“Second Pair of Hands” Law October, 2012

- Allows dental assistants to work with RDHs if assigned by dentist. Will aid in school-based dental sealant programs

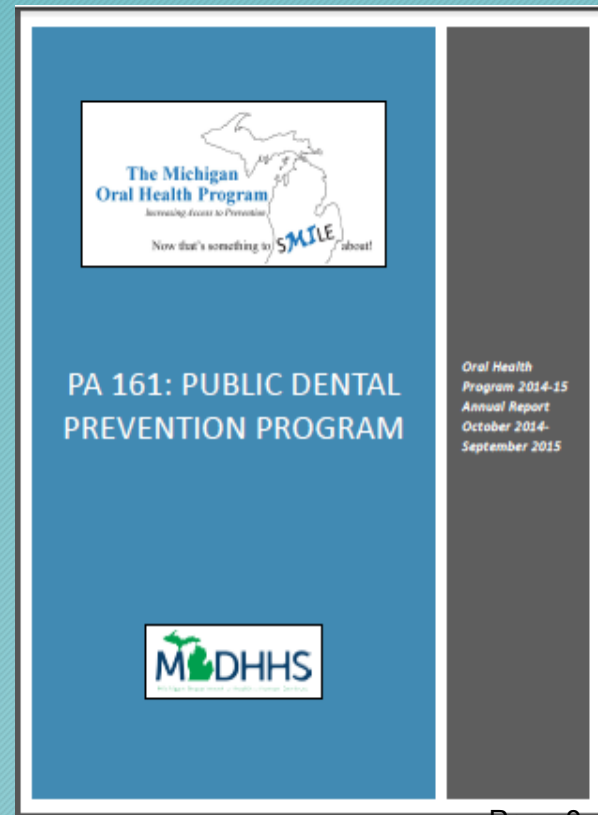
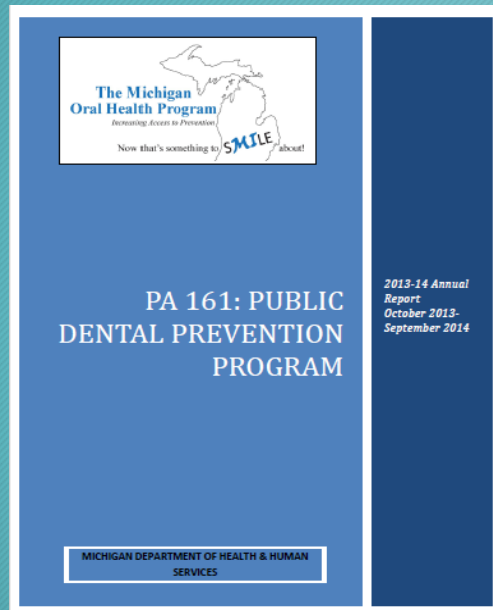

Interventions to Prevent Decay
Michigan PA 161 programs reduce oral health disparities for underserved Michigan residents by providing preventive dental services in non-traditional public health settings. This success has been achieved by allowing dental hygienists associated with a program administered by a local health department, community clinic, Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC), or other non-profit organization to enter the community and provide oral health education and preventive services via remote supervision by a dentist.

The goal of a PA 161 program is to identify and screen high risk population groups, provide preventive dental care, and help refer people to a local dentist for comprehensive care to establish a dental home. PA 161 programs reach populations who have barriers to oral healthcare or lack resources to obtain simple preventive procedures at a dental office or local dental clinic.
