Sample Equipment Operator Permits

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Note To Employer:

Equipment listed on this permit / training certification card require operator selection, training, and testing prior to issuance. Consult MIOSHA General Industry Standards *Part 21, Powered Industrial Trucks, Part 58, Aerial Work Platforms*; and Construction Safety Standards *Part 12, Scaffolds and Scaffold Platforms, Part 13, Mobile Equipment, and Part 32, Aerial Work Platforms*, for specific requirements.

Other Mobile Equipment

MIOSHA General Industry Standards *Part 19, Crawler, Locomotive and Truck Cranes, Part 22, Tractors*; and Construction Safety Standards *Part 10, Cranes and Derricks, Part 15, Excavators, Hoists, Elevators, Helicopters, and Conveyors*, also contain operator selection, training, and testing requirements. However, operator permits or training certification is optional.

LEO is an equal opportunity employer/program.

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Employer responsibility:

- To provide training to employees in the operations, hazards, safeguards, and safe practices of the equipment.
- Maintain the equipment in a condition free of known defects and hazards, which could cause an injury.

Employee responsibility:

- Operate the equipment only after being trained in the operations, hazards, safeguards, and safe practices required by these rules by a qualified person and authorized by the employer.
- Report known defects and hazards to the supervisor.

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
