






Action Plan Essentials:

- The action plan(s) will be emailed to the facility within seven business days
- Provided for either a tele-ICAR or site visit.
- Includes summary report and data analysis (when applicable)

Comprised by Infection Prevention Areas of Focus including:

- PPE
- Hand Hygiene
- Environmental Controls, Cleaning/Disinfecting and Water Management

Divided into Four Columns:

- Priority
- Observation items observed or discussed during consultation
- Action –
 recommendations of
 best practices to reduce
 risk of transmission
- Comments / Support Links – Resource links to learn more information from a variety of sources

Organized by Priority Level:

- Low Informational only
- Medium Risk of regulatory harm
- Medium High Risk of morbidity for staff or residents
- High Risk for mortality or significant morbidity to staff or residents. Immediate action required.
