## ORDER GRANTING A CONDITIONAL TEMPORARY THIRD-PARTY FACILITATOR LICENSE

On May 5, 2020, an Order Establishing Terms, Conditions, and Fees for Third-Party Facilitators (Order) was issued. Pursuant to the Horse Racing Law of 1995 (Act), MCL 431.301 to MCL 431.336, and the Order, ODS Technologies, L.P. d/b/a TVG Network, (TVG) filed an application for a third-party facilitator license.

The application has been reviewed and TVG has made representations that it has not accepted wagers from persons within the state of Michigan in the last 12 months. The submitted application and the representations are the basis for the issuance of a conditional temporary license.

TVG may facilitate wagering on live and simulcast racing upon receipt of a signed statement that provides: (1) TVG has not accepted bets from persons within the State of Michigan since December 20, 2019, the effective date of the amended Act to allow for third-party facilitator licenses; and (2) TVG agrees not to accept wagers in the State of Michigan without a license. TVG understands that full licensure is conditioned on meeting the terms, conditions, and suitability standards contained in § 8(1)(d) and § 10(1)(e), (f) of the Act, the Order, and the Administrative Rules to be promulgated pursuant to the Act.

As permitted by § 8(1)(d)(vi)(A) of the Act, TVG is granted a third-party facilitator license which expires 30 days from the issuance of this order. TVG must comply with the Act, the Administrative Rules, and the Order. The Executive Director may issue sanctions including, but not limited to, revocation or suspension of a license, exclusion from racetrack grounds, or a fine.
