Plan of Care, Part 2 (POC 2) Revision



POC 2 Revision Algorithm

Beginning in Cycle 8 – January 1, 2020

- ▶ Current algorithm will score accurately for all POC 2.
- ▶ Changing the risk level will no longer be required on the Tobacco POC 2.


POC 2 Revision

Form Instructions

Updated form instructions will be attached to all revised POC 2s and will include guidance for multiple domain POC 2s.



Multiple Domain POC 2s



There are two POC 2s that combine multiple domains from the Risk Identifier Score Sheet.



For the multiple domain POC 2s, MIHP providers must pull the POC 2 if one or more domains score on the Risk Identifier Score Sheet.

Multiple Domain POC 2s

- The multiple domain POC 2s may be added to the beneficiary's plan of care based on professional judgement.
- Documentation must support the addition of the multiple domain POC 2.



Multiple Domain – Food/Nutrition POC 2

Food/Nutrition POC 2

- Basic Needs Food
- Basic Needs Nutrition

If Basic Needs Food or Nutrition (or both) have a score on the Risk Identifier, the Food/Nutrition POC 2 must be pulled for the beneficiary's plan of care.

Food/Nutrition POC 2

Certification Requirement

If the nutrition risk is high, a referral and/or RD services must be offered.

(Dietician Services, Section 12: Professional Visits, MIHP Operations Guide)

Food/Nutrition POC 2 – Certification Requirement

- If “Basic Needs Nutrition” scores at that high, referral to RD is required.
- Food/Nutrition will only score high based on “Basic Needs Nutrition” domain and therefore a referral to RD is required.
 - Documentation reminder: referrals to RD services should be documented in the referral section of the PVPN.

Discuss beneficiary/family diet and typical method of accessing food. 2. Discuss food intake changes since becoming pregnant and/or baby was born. 3. Discuss importance of appropriate weight gain and prenatal vitamins (i.e. Folic Acid, Iron) and address any barriers to consistent prenatal vitamin intake during pregnancy. 4. Discuss family and household attitudes, beliefs and practices and how they may impact current diet. 5. Discuss importance of nutritious food intake, maintenance of appropriate weight and encourage discussions with medical care provider or Registered Dietitian. 6. Identify local WIC provider and assist beneficiary with access. 7. Discuss foods to avoid during pregnancy and how to adapt current diet. 8. Discuss food availability in community and identify barriers and solutions. 9. Discuss food assistance programs and assist with application, appointments and follow-up, as needed. 10. Discuss safe storage of foods. 11. Develop a plan for ensuring food access and availability. 12. Discuss medical care provider concerns with nutrition, if applicable. 13. Refer to Registered Dietician. 14. Encourage beneficiary to discuss PICA (eating non-food items) with medical care provider.

Multiple Domain – Medical Considerations POC 2

Medical Considerations POC 2



- Health History Asthma
- Health History Diabetes
- Health History Hypertension

If Health History Asthma, Diabetes or Hypertension (or multiple) have a score on the Risk Identifier, the Medical Considerations POC 2 must be pulled for the beneficiary's plan of care.

- ✓ Documentation in the beneficiary's chart (e.g. *Contact Log, PVPN*) must demonstrate the necessity for addition of the Medical Considerations POC 2 if one of the required domains does not score.

Discuss beneficiary relationship with medical care provider. 6. Discuss stress/depression in relation to medical condition(s) management. 7. Assist with development of an action plan to address medical condition(s) management. 8. Assist with development of a plan to address medical condition(s) risk management. 9. Discuss importance of attending all medical care appointments and following provider recommendations. 10. Refer to Registered Dietician to discuss dietary considerations for medical condition(s). 11. Identify/discuss a support person who is aware of symptoms and treatment guidance. 12. Develop emergency plan for transport to emergency department. 13. Discuss calling 9-1-1 if there is an imminent risk to beneficiary, infant, primary caregiver and/or other person in the home.

POC 2 Revision Field Introduction

August 2019

- Draft Revised POC 2s – Algorithm and Format Update

September 2019

- Draft Maternal POC 2s

October 2019

- Draft Infant POC 2s

January 1, 2020

- MDHHS Approved forms posted on MIHP website and must be utilized with all beneficiaries enrolled on or after 1/1/2020



POC 2 Revision Implementation

- ▶ All beneficiaries enrolled on or after January 1, 2020 must utilize the new MDHHS approved Plans of Care, Part Two.



Revised Education Packet

- ▶ New look and feel
- ▶ Color option *and* simple black and white version
- ▶ Removed outdated information
 - ▶ Reviewed sections for accuracy
 - ▶ Consulted with MDHHS content experts
 - ▶ Updated domains with current terminology
- ▶ Added new sections:
 - ▶ Labor and delivery
 - ▶ Breastfeeding

Lactation CLC or IBCLC?

CLC and IBCLC are “technically” both entry level certifications in the breastfeeding world. However, Michigan chose to approve IBCLC vs CLC for Medicaid recipients.

- ▶ CLC 45 hr. course based on World Health Organization and UNICEF (United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund) breastfeeding course and 2.5 hr. exam—demonstrates *abilities*
- ▶ IBCLC 90 hrs. of approved training—the CLC course can count for 45 hrs.—to prepare for *duties*— and must complete *observed clinical lactation work* prior to taking the 5 hr. competency test

Lactation CLC or IBCLC?

CLC –Certified lactation Counselor

- ▶ 45 hrs. training
- ▶ 2.5 hr. exam
- ▶ No clinical time required prior to exam
- ▶ Abilities
- ▶ Not approved for reimbursement by Michigan Medicaid
- ▶ Can provide services billed under 99402

IBCLC –International Board-Certified lactation Consultant

- ▶ 90 hrs. Training (45 of CLC “counts”)
- ▶ 5 hr. exam
- ▶ Extensive clinical time required prior to exam
- ▶ Duties
- ▶ Approved for reimbursement by Michigan Medicaid
- ▶ May bill post partum, two times, under S9443 with or without a corresponding 99402 visit

IBCLC in MIHP

- Must complete either an MRI or IRI
- May conduct two visits postpartum
- Must bill under mother's Medicaid ID
- Use code S9443
- May be used with a 99402 visit or alone
- Use separate progress note—MDHHS 5641
- Must be a Nurse or Social Worker to bill in MIHP
