

FY 2010 County Revenue Sharing Reserve Fund Allowable Spending Amounts

Below is a listing of the amounts each county may spend from their Revenue Sharing Reserve Fund during the county's 2010 Fiscal Year. This amount shall be included in the county's Fiscal Year 2010 revenue. All amounts are final.

The allowable spending amounts for Fiscal Year 2010 are calculated by growing the allowable spending amounts for Fiscal Year 2009 by the rate of inflation between the State's 2008 and 2009 Fiscal Years. The inflation rate is calculated using the U.S. Consumer Price Index (CPI-U). The inflation rate used for Fiscal Year 2010 is -0.3%.
