Dear Representatives, Senators, and Directors;

Pursuant to 2019 PA 10, the Department is directed to provide a quarterly report on the wrongful imprisonment compensation fund. The specific report language and the department's responses for the Fourth Quarter of Fiscal Year 2024 (July 1, 2024 – September 30, 2024) are as follows:

(a) All payments made from the wrongful imprisonment fund in each prior quarter of the fiscal year, and the total of those payments, including if each payment is part of a new settlement or part of an installment plan.

1. *Michael Griffin v State of Michigan*, Court of Claims No. 23-000152-MZ. On July 18, 2024, a Release and Settlement Agreement was signed, awarding Griffin with \$500,000 in WICA relief. The agreement also awarded attorney Fees and costs was entered providing for the payment of attorney fees in the amount of \$18,000 and \$980.25 respectively.
