Dear Senators, Representatives, and Directors:

MCL 18.1396 directs that the Attorney General notify you in the event of a settlement or consent judgment in excess of \$200,000. Accordingly, I am notifying you that, with the concurrence of the Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC), this case settled for \$200,000.

This case involves ELCRA disparate treatment, retaliation, and hostile work environment claims based on sex, race, and national origin brought by a facility secretary against the MDOC. The allegations arose following a consensual relationship between the plaintiff and her supervisor. The plaintiff alleged that the supervisor harassed her following the end of the relationship. Negotiations resulted in a \$200,000 settlement. Had this matter proceeded to trial, damages and attorney fees in excess of the settlement amount were possible.
