RE: 2025 PA 22 – WICA Quarterly Report – 2nd Quarter of FY 2026

Dear Representatives, Senators, and Directors;

Pursuant to 2025 PA 22, the Department is directed to provide a quarterly report on the wrongful imprisonment compensation fund. The specific report language and the department's responses for the SECOND QUARTER of the Fiscal Year 2026 (January 1, 2026 to March 31, 2026) are as follows:

- (a) All payments made from the wrongful imprisonment fund in each prior quarter of the fiscal year, and the total of those payments, including if each payment is part of a new settlement or part of an installment plan.

TOTAL PAYMENTS OUT OF THE FUND: \$594,810.58

1. *Kenneth Bullock v State of Michigan*, Court of Claims No. 25-000100-MP. On February 9, 2026, the Court signed an Order of Judgement, awarding Bullock with **\$594,810.58** in WICA relief. An order awarding attorney fees and costs was entered providing for the payment of attorney fees in the amount of \$19,250.00 and costs of \$220.00.

All payments were part of a new settlement. Treasury does not make installment payments out of the WICA Fund, nor does the Michigan Department of Attorney General ever agree to such.

\$270,566.51 was deposited in cash interest earnings.

Pursuant to the Department of Treasury's records, as of March 31, 2026, there was \$30,813,342.98 in the Wrongful Imprisonment Compensation Fund.

- (g) The percentage of claims received in the immediately preceding fiscal quarter that were awarded compensation.
