Clinton County was organized in 1839. The county coordinates are Ranges 1 West through 4 West (1W-4W) and Townships 5 North through 8 North (5N-8N). Adjacent counties include Gratiot (north), Saginaw (northeast), Shiawassee (east), Ingham (southeast), Eaton (southwest), Ionia (west), and Montcalm (northwest).
