## CALL TO ORDER

The Autism Council meeting was called to order by Diane Heinzelman at 9:07 am. A quorum was present for the meeting.

# ROLL CALL

A roll call of Council members, MDHHS staff, and guests was completed.

## APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

## Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) UPDATES

<u>Financial Operations Administration-MDHHS Budget:</u> Phil Kurdunowicz and Kristen Jordan reported on FY23 boilerplate items regarding outpatient and inpatient services. Current work is being done to understand the legislative intent behind the legislative provisions

Legislative Update: Marina Wyrzykowski reported on the following bills:

New:

<u>House Bill 6323</u> (Breen) – requires each intermediate school district to employ at least 1 mental health coordinator and 1 emergency/safety manager – EDU/LEGAL Lead, referred to House Rules and Competitiveness Committee

<u>House Bill 6355</u> (Filler) – amends the Mental Health Code to set time limits for when psychological assessments of individuals in hospital emergency rooms must take place and defines who can complete those assessments – No Lead Agency yet assigned, referred to House Health Policy Committee

<u>Senate Bill 1135</u> (MacDonald) – provides for the definition of a "distant site" for a telemedicine visit for purposes of Medicaid reimbursement – DHHS Lead, referred to Senate Health Policy & Human Services Committee

## Updates:

<u>Senate Bill 1012</u> (VanderWall) – Creates student mental health apprenticeship retention and training (SMART) internship grant program – EDU/SBO Lead, signed into law as PA 180 of 2022 on 8/17/22

<u>Senate Bill 101</u> / <u>House Bill 4414</u> (McBroom, LaFave) – *Creates standards and licensing requirements for mental health transport for involuntary psych hospitalization* – DHHS/MSP/LEGAL Lead, SB 101 signed into law as PA 146 of 2022 on 7/20/22

<u>State Hospital Administration</u>: Lisa Grost gave the update on behalf of Dr. Mellos. Caro is no longer admitting individuals with IDD/ASD. Administrative staff are working within MDHHS to find additional support for in-home community-based services.

# Bureau of Children's Service Coordinated Health Policy & Supports (BCCHPS)

MDHHS Current Position Vacancies:

- <u>Clinical Support and Service Navigation Section Manager</u>: Stacy Farrell has been hired for this position. <u>FarrellS7@michigan.gov</u>
- <u>Chief of Staff</u>: Alicia Cosgrove has joined our team starting September 18<sup>th</sup> and will help support Autism Council as well. <u>CosgroveA@michigan.gov</u>
- <u>IDD & ASD Services Section Manager</u>: Working through the hiring process for this position and will hopefully be able to announce in our October Meeting.

<u>Office of the Advocate for Children, Youth, and Families:</u> Patty Neitman reported on steps to improve the delivery of specialty behavioral health services to children, youth and families. This includes prioritizing systemic barriers to access of publicly funded behavioral health services. Patty also highlighted two sections within the division: the Family and Community Partnerships Section lead by Justin Tate, and the Clinical Support and Service Navigation Section lead by Stacy Farrell.

<u>Emergency Department Utilization Data:</u> Phil Kurdunowicz reported on the Fiscal Year 2021 Medicaid Beneficiaries Data regarding ER visits and other services used. (See Acute Care Response presentation attached)

# Presentation and Discussion

<u>Acute Care Response Presentation:</u> Diane Heinzelman provided current and historical context of the Autism Council's efforts to improve acute care response. (*Presentation attached*).

<u>A Family's Experience:</u> Bill and Wendy Ernzen shared their challenging multi-year journey to access care for their daughter, which included their recent need for acute care support. Members suggested that council use their "story" to identify key areas (e.g., evaluation, ABA and behavioral health services, acute care, county/PIHP borders) that resulted in delay and barriers to services and make recommendations for improvement.

<u>Michigan Psychiatric Care Improvement Project:</u> Krista Hausermann presented council with an overview of Michigan's Crisis Services System currently in development. The three primary components include "someone to call" (incorporating 988 and MiCAL), "someone to respond", and "somewhere to go" (safe place for stabilization services). . (Presentation attached)

<u>Model of Intervention:</u> Cam Hosner and Larissa Heise, representing Easterseals Michigan, presented members with a summary of Easterseals Autism Intensive Services. Developed in partnership with Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan, this wraparound approach has been found to be extremely effective to respond to immediate need and assist families to access necessary behavioral health services. #### **Guided Discussion and Next Steps**

Members discussed the 3 presentations and offered the following during discussion:

- Review the Autism Council 2014 Crisis Management Recommendations Report. The recommendations remain primarily the same, but there was a lack of implementation by state infrastructure partners.
- Lack of training and who needs it Support training of skills, accessing of resources and providers
- Expand resources due to lack of availability for care
- Expand funding for these services
- Expand availability of students to be placed in crisis cases to gain experience
- Develop state-wide list of standardized training components
- Letter of support for increased wages for Direct Care Workers to assist with retention and recruitment barriers
- Provide input on barriers with waivers
- •
- Well-rounded care coordination from start to finish
