2023-24

- The [Early Middle College Locations](#) report lets users search for Michigan EMC programs and college affiliations, EMC coordinator information, and which districts have students attending these programs.
- The **Postsecondary Enrollment** metric on the [Parent Dashboard](#) shows the percentage of Michigan high school graduates from the previous year who enrolled in a two- or four-year college.
- The [Special Education Data Portraits – Disability, Age Range and Educational Setting and Demographics](#) reports show different breakouts of students who received special education services.

2022-23

- Data showing student achievement at Michigan's colleges and universities are found in the [College Degrees and Certificates Awarded](#) report.
 - The report has been updated to allow users to view data by program, by college, by demographic or as a trend.
 - The report has also been updated to include Pell Grant eligibility and age demographics.
- The [CTE Programs Offered](#) report contains an interactive map showing the locations of Career and Technical Education programs in Michigan. Users can search for CTE programs by location or by specific program.
- The following metrics on the [Parent Dashboard](#) have been updated:
 - **Postsecondary Completion Rate** shows the percent of students who graduated from two- and four-year colleges/universities within six years of graduating from a Michigan high school.
 - **Postsecondary Persistence Rate** shows the percent of Michigan high school graduates who remain enrolled in college after one year.

2022-23

- The [Postsecondary Student Data File](#) lets users with secure access view student-level information on college enrollment, coursework, cumulative credits, program and award information, and GPAs for students from in-state and out-of-state colleges and universities.
- The Postsecondary [Success Rates](#) report shows the number of degree-seeking students achieving successful outcomes at Michigan's public universities and community colleges. Successes include earning a certificate, associate, or bachelor's degree at a public university or community college or transferring from a community college to a 4-year institution as a degree-seeking student. These rates capture both part- and full-time enrollment, as well as mobility between institutions.
