2022-23

- **School Services and Offerings** on the [Parent Dashboard](#) contains information on schools' select programs and services such as extracurricular activities, electives, support services and more. The data have been updated with information from the MSDS and the Points of Pride section of the EEM as of April 7, 2023.

2021-22

- The **Total School Expenditures Per-Pupil** metric on the [Parent Dashboard](#) shows how much money a district spent on education in a school, divided by the number of students educated in that school.
- Target and performance data on indicators 1 to 14 of the [Special Education Annual Public Reporting](#) for the state, ISDs and districts have been updated. Users can download data for these reports using the Indicator data files **with Part B (Special Education)**. *Early On*® data are available using the **Part C (Early On**®) downloadable file.

- Data showing the revenue a selected district receives from the state per enrolled student will be updated on the [Foundation Allowance](#) report.
- The **Qualified Teaching Staff** metric on the [Parent Dashboard](#) shows the percentage of teachers, by content area, who are certified in the assignment they are teaching.

2021-22

- [**Postsecondary: Progress Toward Sixty by 30**](#) uses data from CEPI and other sources to explore postsecondary enrollment, persistence and completion rates for Michigan students. The report tracks progress toward Michigan's initiative to increase the percentage of adults with postsecondary degrees or certificates to 60% by 2030.
- The [**School-Level Expenditure Report**](#) breaks down expenditures of federal, state and local funds for public schools. Users can compare expenditures at county, city, ISD, district or school levels.
- The Postsecondary [**Success Rates**](#) report shows the number of degree-seeking students achieving successful outcomes at Michigan's public universities and community colleges. Successes include earning a certificate, associate, or bachelor's degree at a public university or community college or transferring from a community college to a 4-year institution as a degree-seeking student. These rates capture both part- and full-time enrollment, as well as mobility between institutions.
