Released to the Public

2021-22 Data

- Data showing the amount of revenue a selected district receives from the state per student enrolled have been added to the <u>Foundation Allowance</u> report.
- The Postsecondary Enrollment, Ratio of Students to Instructional Staff and Ratio of Students to Support Staff metrics have been updated on the Parent Dashboard.

2020-21 Data

- College Remedial Coursework shows the number of Michigan public high school graduates who took at least one remedial course after enrolling in a Michigan college or university the year after high school graduation. The report has been updated with 2020-21 postsecondary data for the 2019-20 high school graduation year.
- Data showing transfer patterns, demographics and performance data for students who transferred into or out of a Michigan college or university have been added to the College Transfer report.
- The <u>College Undergraduate Enrollment</u> report offers a closer look at undergraduates at Michigan's colleges and universities, including the number of degree-seeking students, student age, and whether students graduated from a Michigan public high school the year prior to enrollment.
- The following reports have been updated with postsecondary data for high school graduation years 2019-20 and prior.
 - The <u>College Enrollment by High School</u> report shows the number of Michigan public high school graduates who enrolled in a college or university.

- College Enrollment Destination data show the colleges and universities where Michigan public high school students enrolled.
- Student progression in postsecondary education after high school graduation is shown in the <u>College Progression by Graduating</u> <u>Class</u> report.
- The <u>On-Track College Progress</u> report shows the amount of time Michigan public high school graduates take to accumulate 24 college credits.
- The Postsecondary Persistence and Postsecondary Completion metrics have been updated on the <u>Parent Dashboard</u>.

• The new **Special Education Dashboard** will contain key metrics about students with disabilities in Michigan public schools. The report will show four topic areas: Student count (including graduation/dropout data), performance on target indicators used in annual public reporting, counts of students by disabilities, and proficiency on the M-STEP or PSAT in English (ELA/EBRW) and math. The dashboard will be available to secure users only upon initial release and will be found under the K-12 Grade > Special Education menu for logged-in users.
