Released to the Public

2021-22 Data

- School contact information on the [Annual Education Report](#), [Parent Dashboard](#) and [Our Schools – At A Glance](#) has been updated with data captured in the EEM on Dec. 6, 2021.

2020-21 Data

- The **Michigan Community College Data Inventory Report** data file on the [Community College Data](#) page is a compilation of reports that provide summary information about the activity, enrollment, resources and financial standing of state-supported community colleges.
- The [School-Level Expenditure Report](#) breaks down expenditures of federal, state and local funds for public schools. Users can compare expenditures at county, city, ISD, district or school levels.
- The following [Parent Dashboard](#) metrics have been updated:
 - **English Learner Participation** shows whether at least 95% of English learner students took the WIDA test.
 - **Test Participation** shows whether at least 95% of enrolled students took state tests in all subjects.
 - **Total School Expenditures Per-Pupil** shows the amount of money a district spent on education in a school, divided by the number of students educated in that school.

- The [Student Enrollment Counts](#) report provides the unduplicated count and composition of students attending a specific Michigan district or school.

2021-22 Data

- The [Early Childhood Program Participation by Kindergarten Class](#) report shows the publicly funded early childhood education programs in which students were enrolled before entering kindergarten, such as *Early On*®, Early Childhood Special Education, Great Start Readiness Program, Head Start and GSRP/Head Start Blend.
- The [Pathways to Kindergarten](#) report contains data for publicly funded early childhood education taken by students before enrollment into kindergarten. This report shows the order in which children enrolled in various programs, including developmental kindergarten.

2020-21 Data

- Data showing the number and percent of 3rd, 8th and 11th grade students who were proficient on the M-STEP, PSAT and SAT and were identified as “Section 31a At Risk” will be updated in the [At Risk Student](#) report.
- Data showing student achievement at Michigan’s colleges and universities are found in the [College Degrees and Certificates Awarded](#) report.
- [College Remedial Coursework](#) shows the number of Michigan public high school graduates who took at least one remedial course after enrolling in a Michigan college or university the year after high school graduation.
- The **Community College Demographic Enrollment Profile** data file on the [Community College Data](#) page shows the number of students enrolling in and receiving degrees at Michigan community colleges by age, gender and race/ethnicity.
- The [Postsecondary Student Data File](#) allows users with secure access to view student-level information on college enrollment, coursework, cumulative credit, program and award information, and GPAs for students from in-state and out-of-state colleges and universities.
- The [Schools of Choice and Other Non-Resident Enrollments](#) report displays counts and percentages of students enrolled in a school outside of the district where they live.
- The **Percent of Graduates from High School who are Proficient on the SAT** metric on the [Parent Dashboard](#) will be updated.
- The following reports will be updated with postsecondary data for high school graduation years 2019-20 and prior:

- The [College Enrollment by High School](#) report shows the number of Michigan public high school graduates who enrolled in a college or university.
- [College Enrollment Destination](#) data show the colleges and universities where public high school students enrolled.
- Student progression in postsecondary education after high school graduation is shown in the [College Progression by Graduating Class](#) report.
- The [On-Track College Progress](#) report shows the amount of time Michigan public high school graduates take to accumulate 24 college credits.

2019-20 Data

- The [English Learner Student Growth](#) report shows how much growth in learning the English language, as measured across two consecutive years of the WIDA ACCESS for ELLs, English learner students made in comparison to their EL peers.
