

Program Requirements

- All daycares and early childhood education centers must be licensed with the State of Michigan at the time of request for test kits.
 - The test kits will be sent to the address on the license.
 - o License number will be required at time of request.
 - Statewide Search for Licensed Childcare Centers and Homes
- Types of COVID-19 tests available
 - Point of Care
 - Must be administered on-site by a trained professional for aged 5 years and older
 - Reporting of results are required
 - State, Local, and Federal reporting requirements for antigen tests that are administered on-site by a trained professional are satisfied by utilizing the Michigan Antigen Testing Results portal.
 - Positive results must be reported individually within 4 hours of completion of the test.
 - Negative results may be reported as an aggregate number within 24 hours of completion of the test.
 - Requires a CLIA Waiver to administer
 - A Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) Certificate of Waiver (CoW) is a certification that allows a facility to legally examine a person through waived tests to assess health, diagnosis or determine treatment. The antigen tests provided by MDHHS require any facility that is administering these tests to obtain a CLIA waiver to legally preform the test. No specific credentials are required to obtain a CLIA Waiver. The testing site administering the test must follow the guidelines specified under the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).
 - CLIA waiver certificate cost is \$180 for two years.
 - To apply for a CLIA Waiver: For MDHHS testing program complete all sections of the <u>CMS 116 CLIA Application</u>.

 - CLIA Waiver FAQ

- Consent Forms are required for POC testing for those aged 5-17
 - All children receiving point of care COVID-19 testing at a daycare or early childhood education center must have a consent form signed by a parent/guardian.
 - It is the responsibility of the daycare to create a consent form for their location.
 - o Consent forms should be kept on-site for up to a year.
- Over the Counter
 - At-home test kit
 - COVID-19 test that can be sent home with staff, participants, and their families
 - Does not require reporting or CLIA Waiver
 - Limit of 2 OTC test kits per household each box contains 2 test kits, totaling 4 test kits per household
 - MDHHS recommends that daycare/ECE programs should utilize permission slips when sending OTC test kits home.
- Students/participants must be attending the designated licensed site to receive OTC test kits.
 - o POC test kits will only be provided for staff and participants over age 5.
 - o Only staff working for the designated licensed site should receive test kits.
- Daycare/Early Childhood Education center must be open and operational at time of request to receive COVID-19 test kits.
