

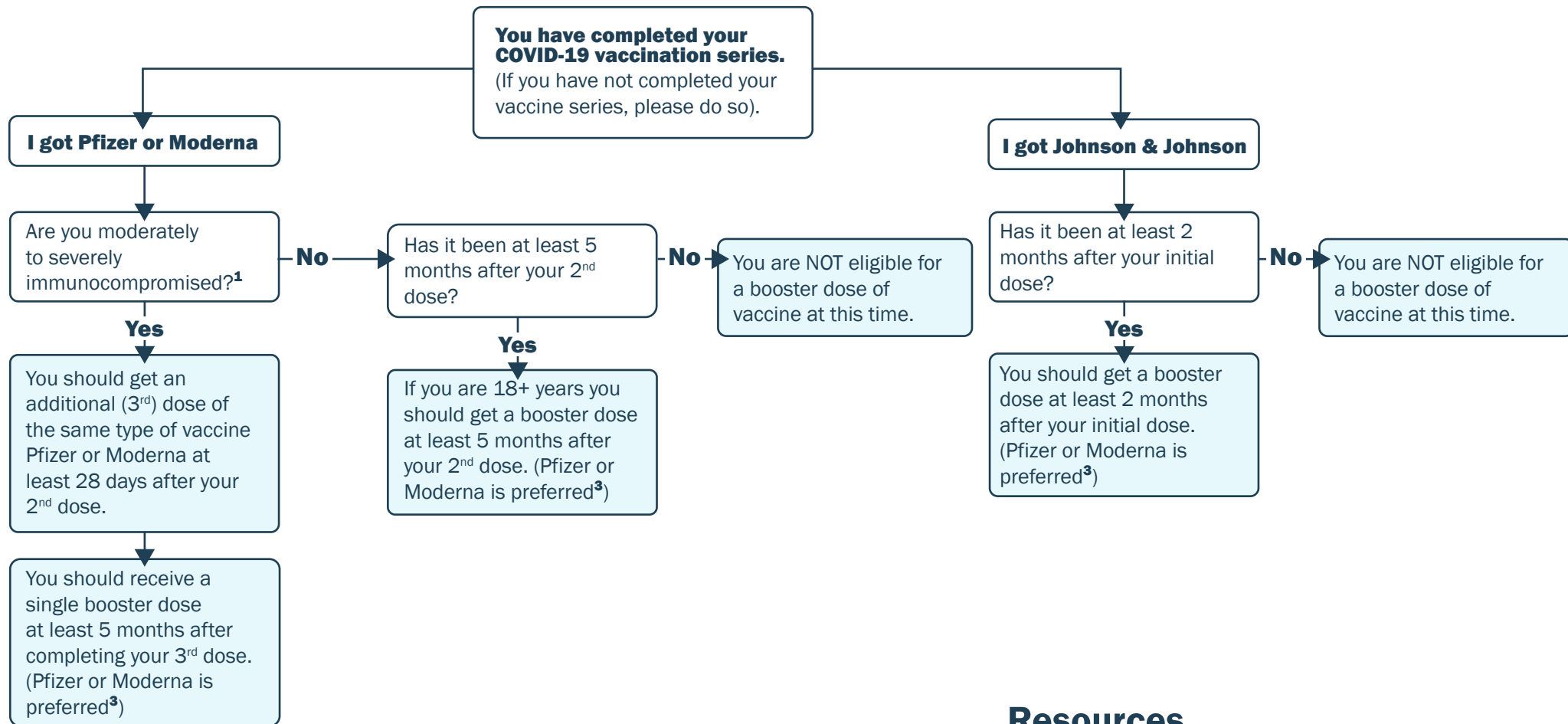
Who is eligible for an extra dose of COVID-19 vaccine?

18+ years old

Reminder!

Bring a copy of your COVID-19 vaccination record card with you to your appointment.²

Some people may prefer a different vaccine type for their booster; mixing and matching is allowed. In most situations, Pfizer or Moderna vaccines are preferred for primary and booster doses.³

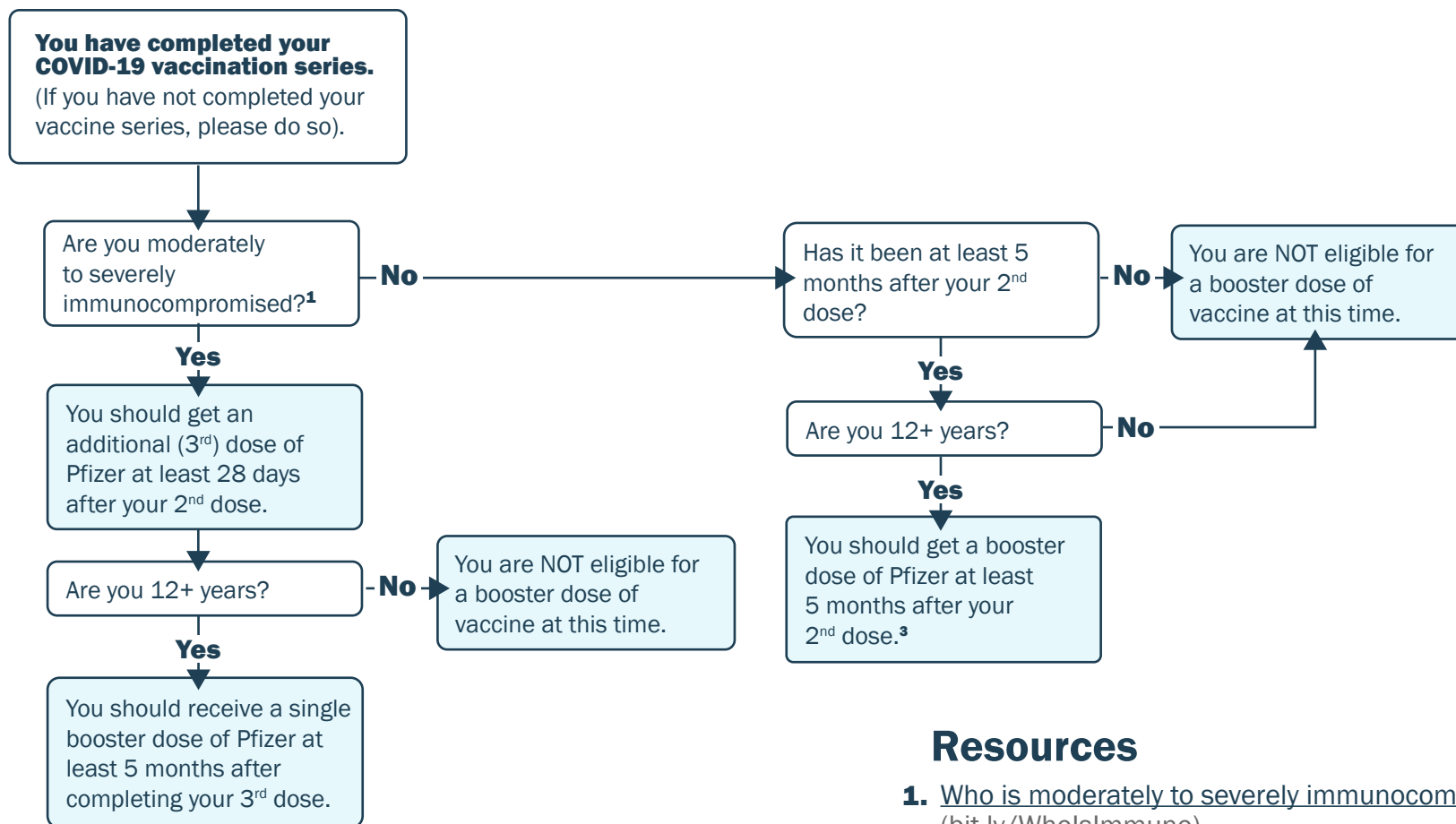
Who is eligible for an extra dose of COVID-19 vaccine?

Reminder!

Bring a copy of your COVID-19 vaccination record card with you to your appointment.²

If you are 5–17 years the only vaccine you should receive is the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine.
